Preface

On Invitation from the Principal of SIES Nerul College of Arts, Science and Commerce, vide letter Ref No: SIES/COMM/DEG 592 of 2020, a three members Gender Audit Team consisting of Principal A.P. Mahajan, Principal Parvathi Venkatesh and Dr. Hiren Dand visited the college on 6th March,2020. The committee was provided with relevant information prior to the visit on six Key Focus Areas as identified by the IQAC Cell of the college viz...

- 1. Demographic profile of students from gender perspective
- 2. Gender statistics of staff (teaching & non-teaching)
- Gender representation in various functional committees of the college during the last five years (including Statutory committees formed as per UGC and University of Mumbai norms)
- Female participation in Extension activities (including those arranged by NSS, DLLE and Women Development Cell)
- 5. Academic and sports achievements of girls
- 6. Research activities of female faculty

The audit team was briefed by the Principal about the strategy followed at the college towards realising gender equality. After due deliberations with the stake holders of the College on vital areas of institutional functioning from gender perspective in place, the following report is presented for consideration. Recommendations

The main findings of the audit show that in general, all the departments and students are aware about the need for gender sensitization at a general level. As the college is keen in implementing effective Gender Policy, the auditors, on the basis of their findings, recommend the following with respect to the Gender Audit conducted in the College:

- 1. WDC to design an action plan every year and report in the year end to IQAC / CDC about gender mainstreaming initiatives taken in the college.
- Initiatives undertaken by WDC on Self Defence Courses, Yoga workshops and Gender Sensitization Programmes and imparting continuing education on gender sensitivity etc. be planned, conducted on regular basis and be recorded.
- 3. Proactive role of NSS and DLLE be continued by introducing new practices to understand the social fabric through awareness programs in compliance with University requirements, Gender Policy of the institution, and the applicable standards to produce desirable outcomes.
- 4. Certain existing processes (e.g. cleanliness, surveillance, ICT facilities, Feedback methodology etc.) could benefit from further review in order to improve their efficiency, fairness and consistency from gender perspective.
- 5. Yoga Wellness Camps may be arranged and girls to be encouraged to participate for healthy body and mind.
- 6. The Departments may consider introduction of institution specific & subject related add-on courses for students for life skills and gender empowerment (e.g. short course on Human rights by Law department, gender and environment by environment science dept, relationship management by Commerce Faculty Departments. etc.)
- 7. Introduction of a Counseling cell (for both career and personal counseling) by qualified counselors has a large scope to become proactive.
- 8. WDC and / or IQAC to attend students' responses at micro level towards improvement in infrastructural facilities/ maintenance like separate space for LCR, fixtures and cleanliness in ladies' wash rooms, improvement in canteen facility etc.
- 9. Response to grievances recorded in suggestions box be commenced on Regular intervals and action taken within reasonable time period be displayed on notice board to develop faith of girl students on the system.

- 10. More students' representation to be introduced in various committees like ICC, Grievance redressal committee, anti ragging committee.
- 11. Coach/es may be appointed in specific sports in which there is scope for uplifting participation of girls at national level.
- 12. Due care be taken to instill confidence in the minds of female students by spreading information on availability of effective CCTV surveillance in the college premises.
- 13. Understanding to be generated among student community of the extent to which gender equality has been internalized and acted upon by staff by identifying and sharing information on mechanisms, practices and attitudes that have made a positive contribution in the organization.
- 14. Some of the Gender sensitive Human Resource Policies (remedial teaching, Counseling etc.) when implemented systematically as per applicable standards can prove more effective.
- 15. An ongoing process of benchmarking and accountability framework may be introduced to measure progress in promoting gender equality.

"Gender Sensitization at workplace" was a one day workshop arranged by the B.Com Department in collaboration with the IQAC Committee

The Workshop was held in the A.V. Room on 1st September 2018, 10 am onwards.

The objective was to promote a holistic development, empowerment and gender sensitization through inspiring initiatives impacting women, forging synergy amongst various participants and creating a conducive environment to impact social change.

The facilitator for the workshop was Ms. Shashikala Mugdal - A Project coordinator and Senior Researcher with Advanced Centre of Women's studies at TISS, along with her was a Co-Facilitator Ms. Aishaanyaa Tewari a Mental Health Professional and Social Worker with TISS.

With a view to ensure effective awareness on women's rights, problems, prospects, sensitization, challenges that will transform and inspire overall development and empowerment of woman. There were 25 participants in the seminar and it was held exclusively for the Teaching and Non Teaching staff.

Before the workshop commenced both the Facilitators were felicitated by our Vice Principal Dr. Koel Roy Choudhury

The Workshop started by making everyone sits in a circle, and there were around 80 postcards which were laid in the centre. The participants had to pick 1 or 2 postcards which resonated with their likings, characters and feeling, and say it out aloud, this exercise was done to analyse self, and let other people know a bit more about selves.

Post this exercise, Ms. Shashikala addressed the various issues faced by women in all walks of life. She spoke about how the sex ratio is skewed in favour of the men and said that gender sensitization cannot be complete without sensitizing the men. She said that although women are visible in the grass root levels, their presence is scarce at the top management. She also raised the issue that women are perpetually excluded from decision making at every step of the ladder, starting from the household to the top layers of policy making.

Ms. Aishaanyaa started her session through a wonderful ppt presentation which was very informative in which she touched various issues related to depression faced by men and women throughout their lives. She spoke about the high stress levels of women due to their dual role of care-takers and career managers. She highlighted the need for early identification and intervention of depression in women dealing with such issues. She spoke at length mental health of both the genders. She emphasized being happy and requirement of every human being.

Post the PPT presentation there was a Tea Break where every participant was encouraged to share their experiences, thoughts, views about discrimination which took place in their day to day lives. Also during this time 10 photographs were displayed in the PPT in which the photographs showed a lot of gender fluidity and people were asked to express their opinion for the photographs.

Then the next exercises were the "privilege walks" an experiential activity to highlight how people benefit or are marginalized by systems in our society. There are much iteration of such walks with several focusing on a single issue, such as race, gender, or sexuality. This particular walk is designed with questions spanning many different areas of marginalization, because the goal of this walk is to understand intersectionality. Many people with certain privileges never notice them, because they are so woven into the mainstream that those who have them cannot see them. For everyone, understanding and acknowledging privileges is the key to understand why and how they react and perceive their surroundings.

The last exercise was where 2 groups were made and each and every participant was asked to speak their heart out about the discrimination or the causal sexism faced by them in day to day lives. It was ensured, what was said in the circle stayed in the circle. With this the workshop concluded after 3 hours of intense session and the participants were awarded a certificate of participation.

He elucidated the meaning of 'gender' – biologically – and showed how natural it is for someone to turn out to be a 'Transgender' – who shouldn't be shamed due his biological and physical attribute. Also, he surfed students through the origin of gender dispute and discrimination and gave simple but effective measures which can be implemented right from an individual's home. E.g. To not only help mothers, but also reduce her burden by taking a certain responsibility at home for as long as possible – which would create responsible millennials in the longer run.

It was a wonderful learning experience for students and something, which challenged our age old beliefs and created impact on students' mentality but incares positive way. The Seminar ended after a QnA Round at around 11:30 a.m.




Workshop on Gender Sensitivity and Sexual Harassment

Overall the session was very good and enriching. Students who attended this session were extremely satisfied and joyous.



The program ended with an inspiring speech by Mrs. AshwathyRavindran, the Co-convenor of WDC.


Later the self-defence activity was conducted by the Trainer Mr. YashRambhia, BMS Alumni who is also the Founder and Director of Ironwolf - 2017.



The people who came from outside and our club rotaractors, including our own team was really satisfied for the level the event was held and that was the best and happiest part for us.


