


Training Programme on Total Solid Waste Management for different Stakeholders of SIES, Nerul Campus

- What Constitutes E-waste?

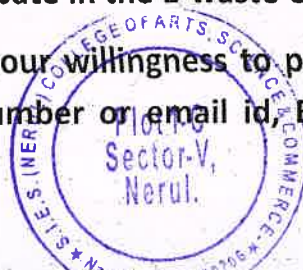

A certificate of Responsible Recycling will be issued by E-incarnation which is recognised by Maharashtra Pollution Control Board.



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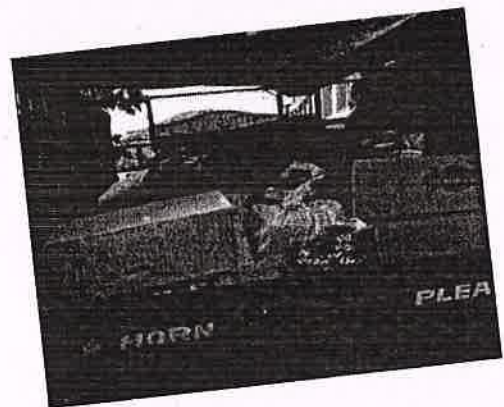

Bio-Composting Committee

Report 2018-19

Biocomposting – It's a nature's way to recycle organic waste in a useful product – fertilizer. Process is applicable for all types of biodegradable organic wastes including "Nirmalya" (floral waste). Approximately 5-10 kg Nirmalya is generated from SIES temples on daily basis. Since 2013, the project is ongoing in the SIES campus. The main objective of the project is to convert waste into a useful resource. The temple waste (flowers, garlands and offerings) which otherwise were thrown in the municipal bin are now converted into a nutrient rich manure which can be used as an additive for providing the basic nutrients like NPK for the growth of the plants.

The specifications of the pit are as mentioned below:

1. Length of the pit: Approximately 6 to 7 ft per pit
2. No. of pits: 2
3. Width: Approx. 2 to 2.5 ft
4. Depth : 2.5 ft
5. Bottom of the pit had red soil covered with small pieces of broken bricks
6. Pit covered with the acrylic shade on the top
7. Covered from all the sides with plastic sheets as a protection from shade.

The compost pit was closed for maintenance, after which the composting process was again started from 10th October 2018. The first batch of compost was produced in the month of February 2019 and was analyzed for the quality parameters by M.Sc. Part 2 in the M.Sc. Environmental Science laboratory. Compost was distributed to our teaching, non teaching staff and students as. We are planning to sell our compost.

The following are the parameter values:

pH:	6.63
Nitrogen:	5.28%
Phosphorus:	4.67 kg/hect
Potassium:	72.80 kg/hect
Organic Matter:	11.64%

Report on Biocomposting Tumbler (8th October 2019)

The Biocomposting Project of organic waste was initiated on 8th October 2019 by the Conservation Club and Department of M. Sc. EVS of SIES (Nerul) College of Arts, Science & Commerce. Conservation club of our college received biocomposting tumbler from My Green Society NGO in the month of September 2019.

The temple waste (flowers, garlands and offerings) and other organic waste (kitchen waste) which otherwise were thrown in the municipal bin are now converted into a nutrient rich manure which can be used as an additive for providing the basic nutrients like NPK for the growth of the plants.

Benefits of Composting:

- Reduces Landfill Waste
- Recycles kitchen and yard waste
- Creates Nutrient Rich Soil
- Helps to Reduce Gross Greenhouse Gas Emissions

The project is going on 2nd floor of the college building. Dual Biocomposting Tumbler is placed besides lift area and it is enclosed in Chain link fence. Biocomposting Tumbler is maintained by Conservation Club and Department of M. Sc. EVS.

Specifications of Biocomposting Tumbler

- Tumbler quantity: 2 Tumbler
- Capacity: 189 Liters *2
- Dimensions: Width - 63in. Height- 42 in. Depth- 31.5 in. Weight- 345Kg

The process of biocomposting is started with the loading of biodegradable waste (flower waste & kitchen waste) in the tumbler. To maintained C:N ratio dry leaves and coco peat added to the same. Further biological inoculum added to the same tumbler to speed up the composting process. Water sprinkling is necessary to maintain the moisture level in the compost. Tumbler requires several rotations a week which facilitate aeration and making oxygen available for the micro organisms to carry out the composting process.

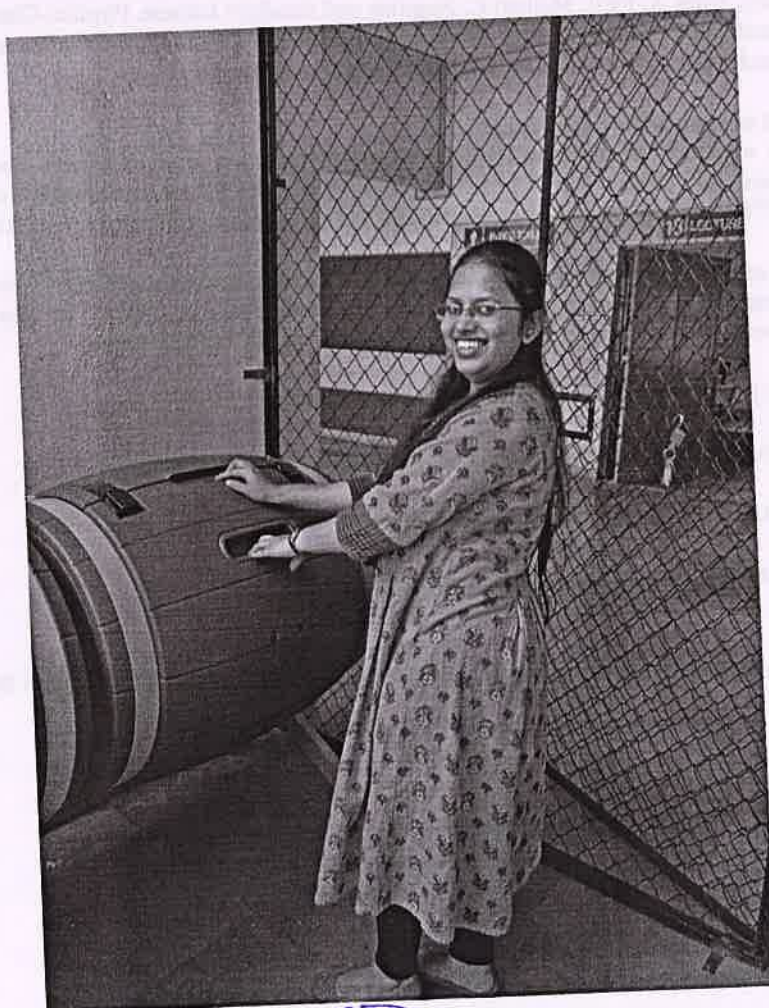

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

Report on Biocomposting Workshop

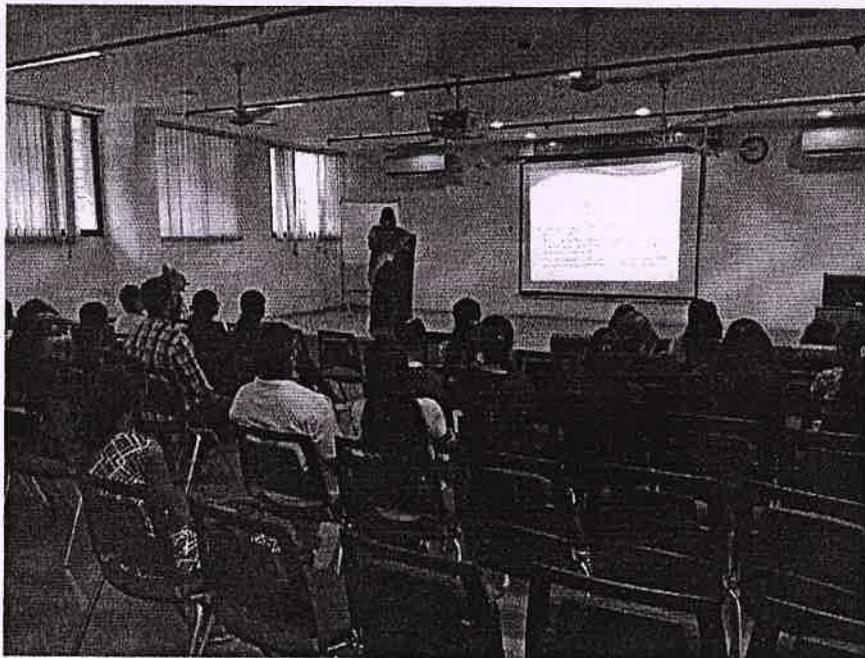

Rationale of the Project

Economic constraints are an important barrier in a country like India. Surviving on limited incomes, in a country where 59.2% of the population lives on less than US\$2 a day, rural households cannot afford expensive menstrual products such as sanitary napkins, and tampons lest they sacrifice food and water. Given these tough economic realities, even if women are aware of their menstrual needs, they cannot afford to spend on expensive supplies. This calls for a need to develop cost-effective, sustainable menstrual hygiene supplies.

Many girls from the financially weaker sections of society do not have access to sanitary napkins. They use and then reuse the same cloth over a period of several months, leading to infection. Additionally, they skip school for one week every month, because of the sheer embarrassment of staining. This leads to a backlog in their studies and their grades fall, which, in turn, makes them lose interest in education over a period of time. Their parents also become convinced that there is no use of wasting money on the girls' education when their daughters are not performing well. Eventually, the Girl Students are denied education, because of this health issue.

The Mission

Shree Shankara Hindu Mission has launched Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) a women's project on 8th March, 2018, on the occasion of International Women's Day. Menstrual Hygiene Management has become a must for Girls in Schools and Colleges, in order to ensure cleanliness, avoid infection and maintain good health. There are over 300 million women in India who do not use sanitary napkins during menstruation period, because of lack of awareness and availability. Also, because, a majority of the women, who are below poverty line, cannot afford. In the absence of menstrual hygiene products, women and adolescent girls in this country make use of dirty rags, bark, ash and mud, which translates into a loss of 50 working days in a year and leading over 23 percent school dropout rate among girls, who have attained the age of puberty.

Shree Shankara Hindu Mission, Matunga, Mumbai is committed to change this present disturbing picture in India by providing affordable, biodegradable and high quality sanitary pads to women who currently do not have access to sanitary pads.

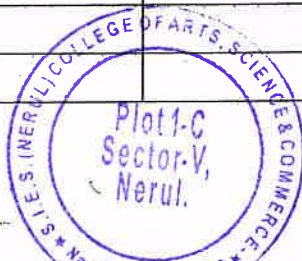
