



- The Rakhi kits were sourced from Paryavaran Dakshata Mandal, an NGO in the environmental sustainability and conservation space. Ms. Chitra Mhaske was the facilitator who had conducted the workshop. The proceeds from the sale of the kits would go to the benefit of the tribals at the Melghat region of Maharashtra.
- Students using their creativity made Rakhis from Recyclable and eco friendly products such as bamboo, paper and bio- friendly threads. Students enjoyed making Rakhis which was later Sent to Major Thomas who is posted at Guhawati, Assam.
- The proceeds after the expenses paid were later sent to Ms. Chitra Mhaske for development and upliftment of the tribal population in Malghat Region of Maharashtra.






Voter ID Drive

BLOOD DONATION CAMP

On 9th October 2015 SIES College organised a blood donation camp from 8:00a.m to 3:00 p.m. In Collaboration with Think Foundation & Samarpan Blood bank Chembur. A week prior to the camp Mr Vinay Shetty visited the campus and went class to class talking about all the positives, precautions and the myths of donating blood. Mr. Vinay Shetty also spoke and rendered knowledge to students in each class about Thalassaemia and stem cell research. Following which the students came in large numbers on the D-day to donate blood.

In all 240 students came forward with the intentions to donate blood but only 182 students were allowed to donate due to medical restrictions like under age, anaemia, less than the required level of haemoglobin count or underweight. In return the students were given blood donors card and a certificate from the blood bank.

- Later on, the event concluded by the extravagant dinner for all the students and the teachers as well as Alumni Committee members.

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


Around 100 saplings of indigenous plants like Jamun, Neem, Peepal, Mango, Bahawa, Bel, Jack Fruit, Palash were planted.



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


Date: 23rd September, 2019

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
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PAPER BAG MAKING ACTIVITY


Conclusion:




Objective: To reuse, reduce & recycle e-Waste.

Accordingly, the waste of various electronic products were collected prior to the competition and distributed amongst the students. Then, students made various décor, new gadgets out of the e-Waste collected.



Below are the extracts of the e-mail received from Dr. V. Shankar- President- SIES , in addition to which have included few guidelines for your reference and necessary follow up.

Please follow the instructions meticulously.

Lockdowns are not a permanent and lasting solution to prevent the spread of Coronavirus. While they have a well-defined role in putting brakes on the virus transmission during peak times of the pandemic, effective management is essentially keeping in place a COVID-19 protocol during the revival of all economic activities and human endeavors.

We need to follow a comprehensive and well-structured preventive approach for each department / laboratories / library or other places of learning. Before the students are allowed to come to the colleges, we need to set up the following SOP in each department / Laboratories / Library or other place of learning.

- 1. The entry of vehicle for staff and students will be from the Corporation Bank gate.
- 2. There will be only entry and exit gate for students and staff from the gate near the lawn area. The backside gate will be closed.
- 3. Full Body sanitization machine (automatic) at the entrance (Near Lawn).
- 4. Protective gears for security personnel and all those who are exposed maximum in operating the various hygiene systems.
- 5. Human body non-contact thermal scanner by the security guard for every one entering the college building.
- 6. Foot operated hand sanitizer at the second gate of the main entrance before entering the lobby of the office (near room no.7).
- 7. Sprayer powered by hand and battery in each floor, Multi surface disinfectant liquid sodium hypochlorite 5% for doors, knobs, window handles, furniture surface, trash cans, sinks toilets, bath tubs, floor drains, ventilators etc. with a written protocol for frequency and mode of spraying.

- 8. Pulse Oxy meter for recording the level of oxygen supply in the lungs and pulse for each teaching / non-teaching staff at the entry point to the department.
- 9. Wearing of face cover / mask and gloves must for Teaching and Non-Teaching staff is compulsory.
- 10. Foot operated Sanitizer will also be kept in office, outside Principal cabin, outside four staff rooms, library and laboratory. All Head of the Department should see that it is not misused by the students.
- 11. All class IV Laboratory staff / library staff / office staff wearing of Uniform is Compulsory. The uniform should be cleaned daily in Dettol and warm water.
- 12. No staff or visitors will be allowed to enter office in a group, only one person at a time. The visiting hours need to be followed strictly at the gate by the security guard.
- 13. Postman and Courier need to submit the letters / documents with security guard at the College entrance.
- 14. All visitors' queries will be answered at the counter itself.
- 15. In order to maintain a social distance of 6 feet in public, all events / public gathering stay cancelled till the pandemic is eradicated.
- 16. Social distancing guidelines will be displayed in the library, students / teachers common rooms, laboratories and computer lab.
- 17. All Library and Laboratory staff shall maintain cleanliness of reading tables, chairs, and experiment tables, computers desktops. Proper sanitizing should be done every day before and end of the session.
- 18. There will be staggered lunch break for Teaching and Non-Teaching staff. Try to get own lunch or breakfast prepared at home.
- 19. A massive deep cleaning of the entire premises by the Housekeeping agency since after about 3 months the facilities are being put to use.
- 20. A comprehensive SOP for use of the toilets. A housekeeping staff to be available at all times on call. Cleaning hours to be displayed at the entrance to the toilets and no one allowed using the facility during the cleaning process.
- 21. All products entering the college building should be disinfected before it is handled by SIES Staff.
- 22. A self-disclosure form (copy enclosed) is to be filled in by every faculty and staff members before being allowed to enter the premises.
- 23. It is the responsibility of the Head of the Department that all are following precaution and guidelines. If anyone is found negligence in duty or compromise in the above SOP, strict disciplinary action will be taken.

We are entering a phase of new normal. Please learn to embrace the new work environment quickly. Old habits die hard. In our interest and that of the students, let us leave behind the several old habits that are not conducive to pandemic times.
