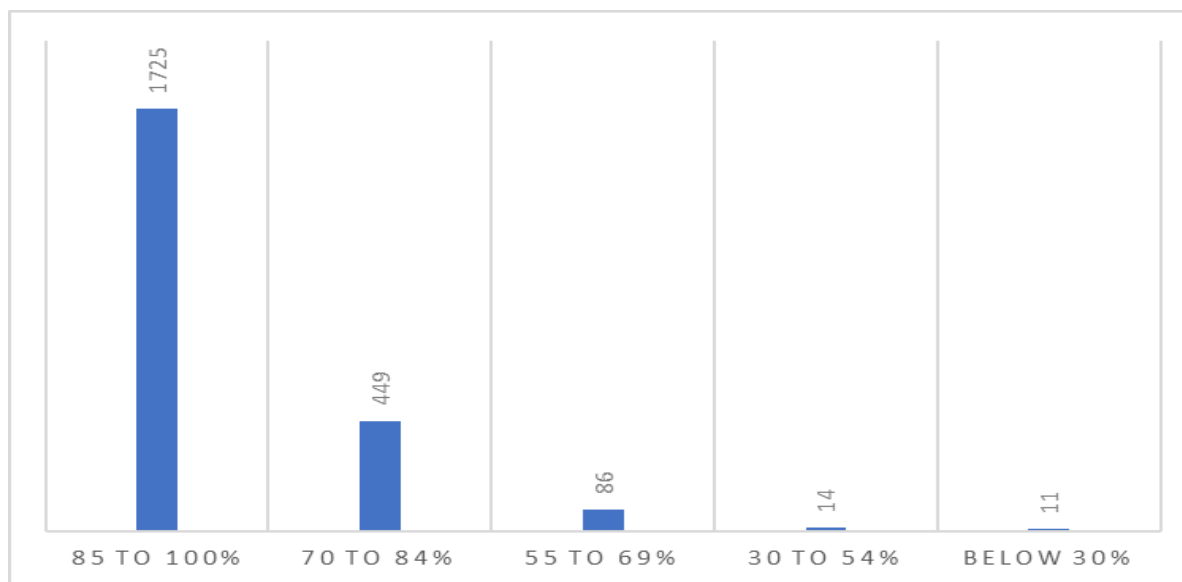

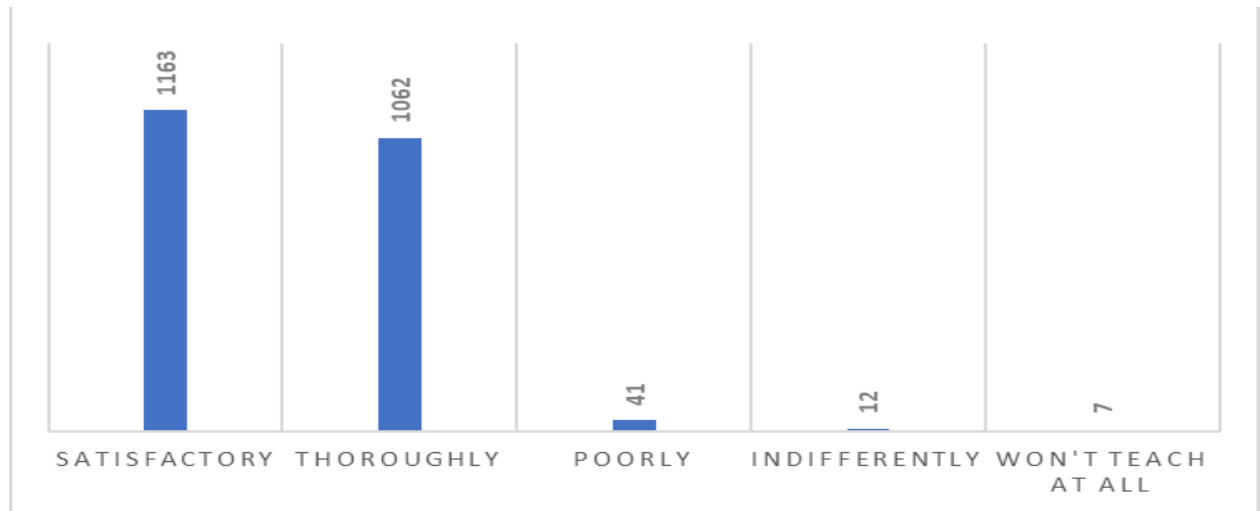

Q1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?



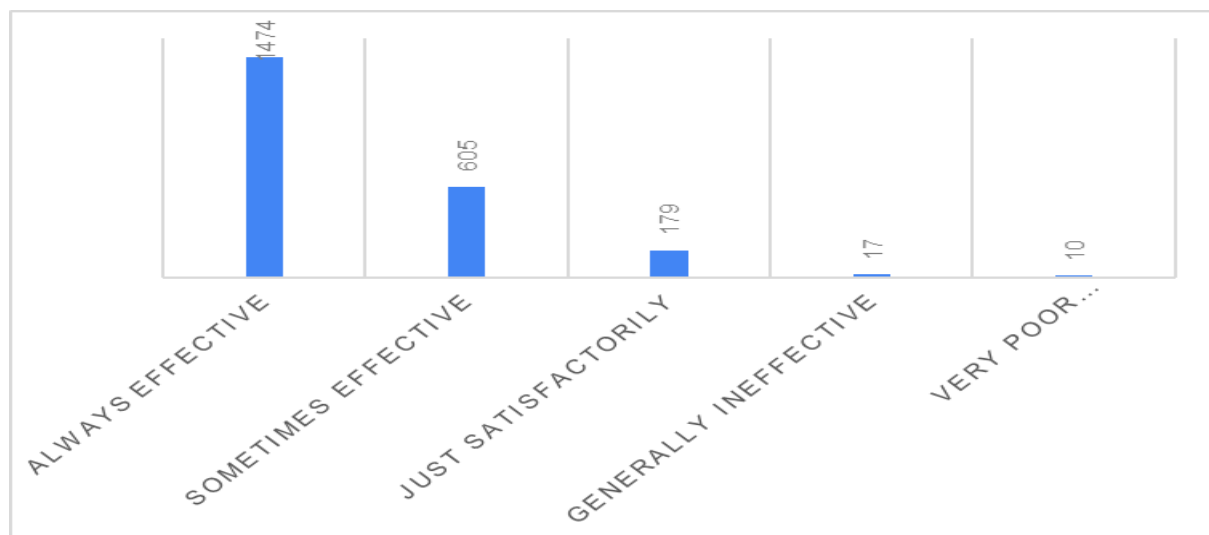

Q2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?



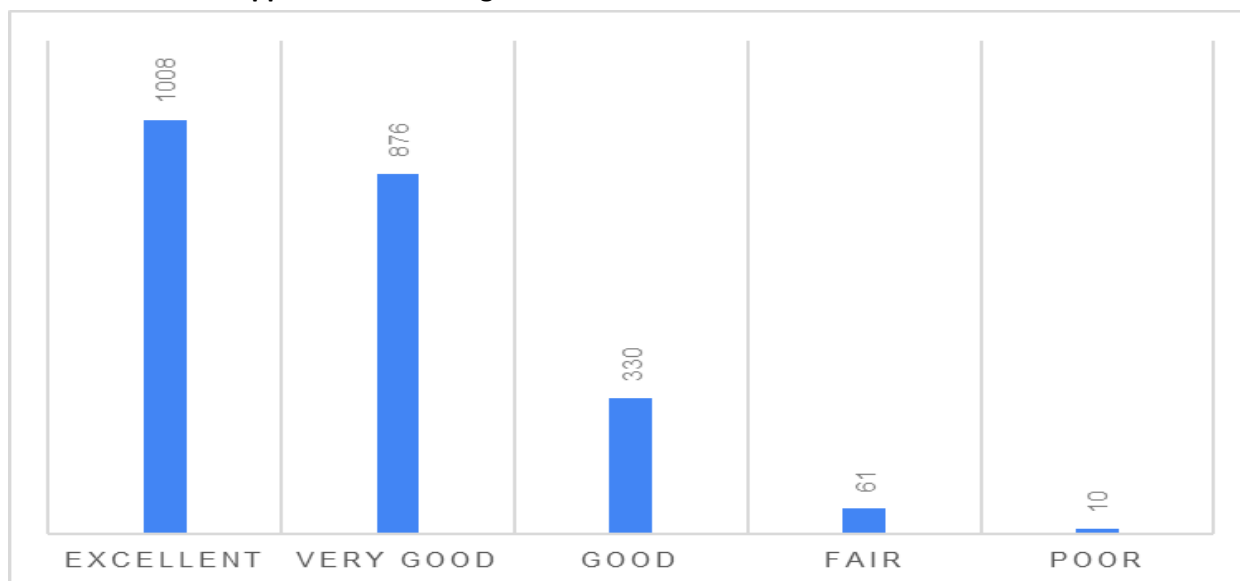

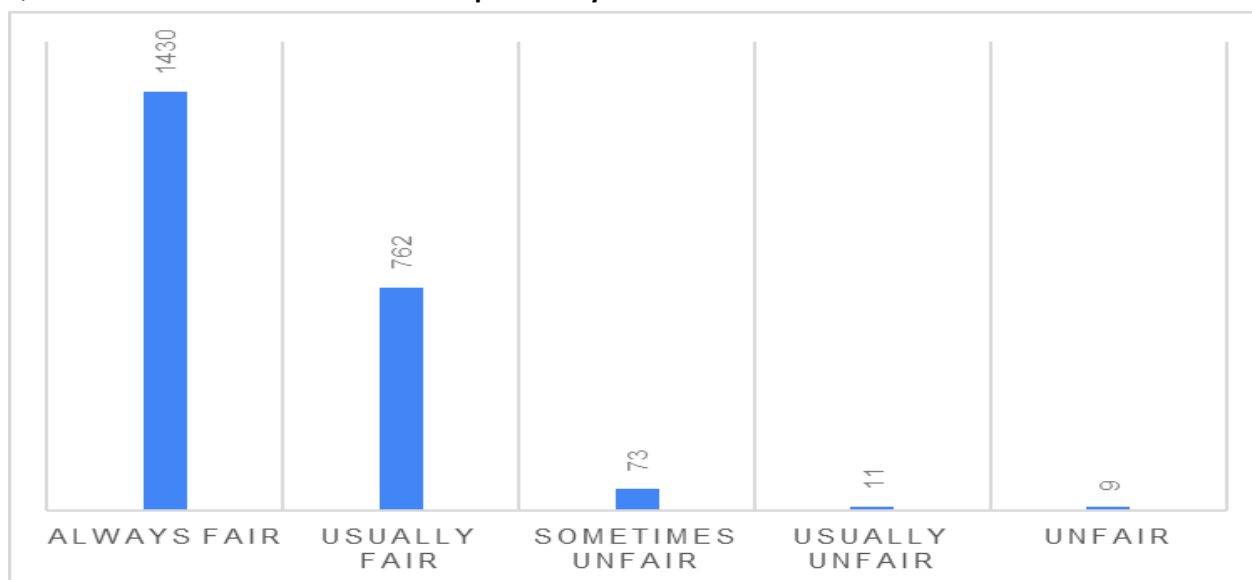

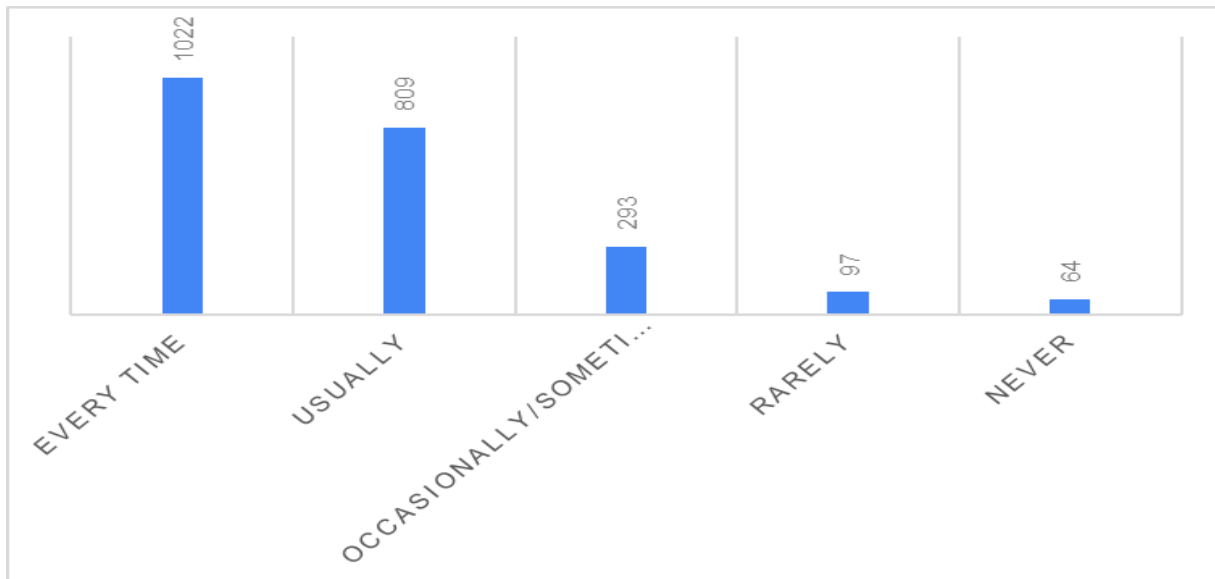

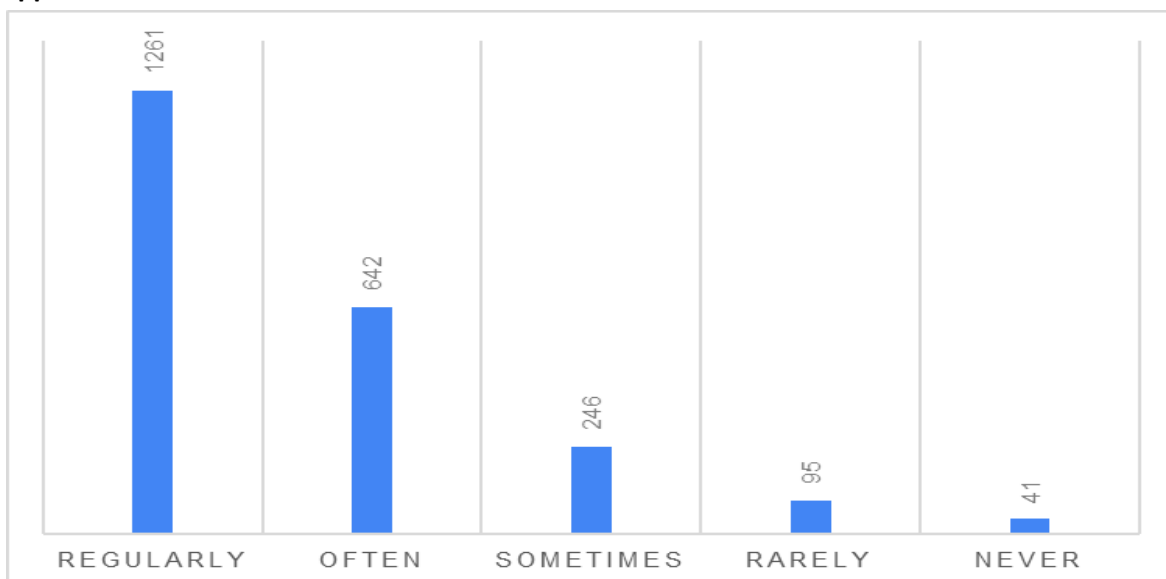

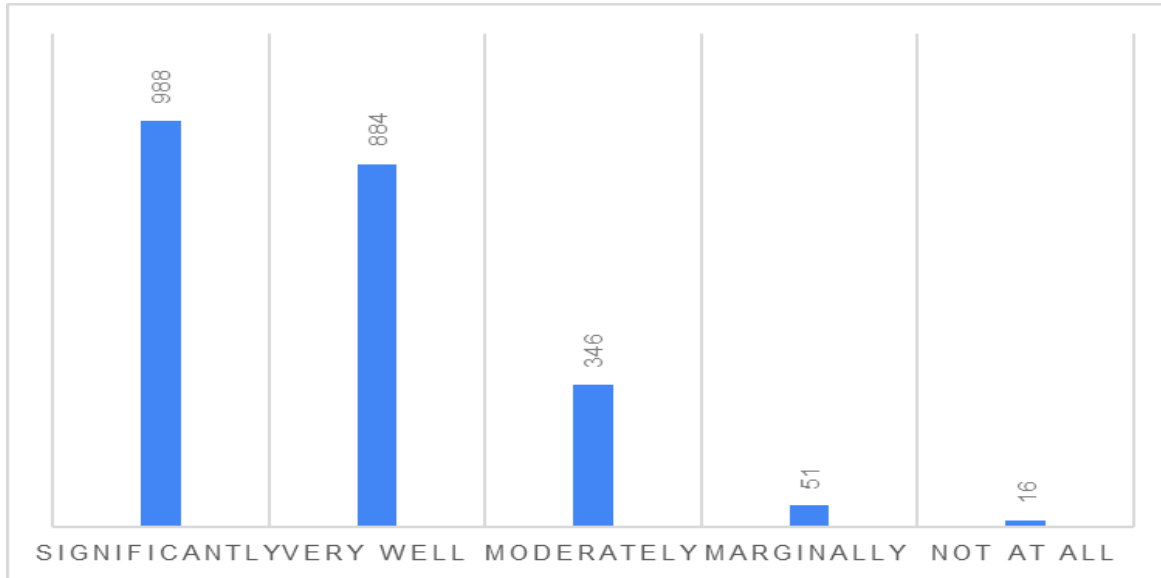

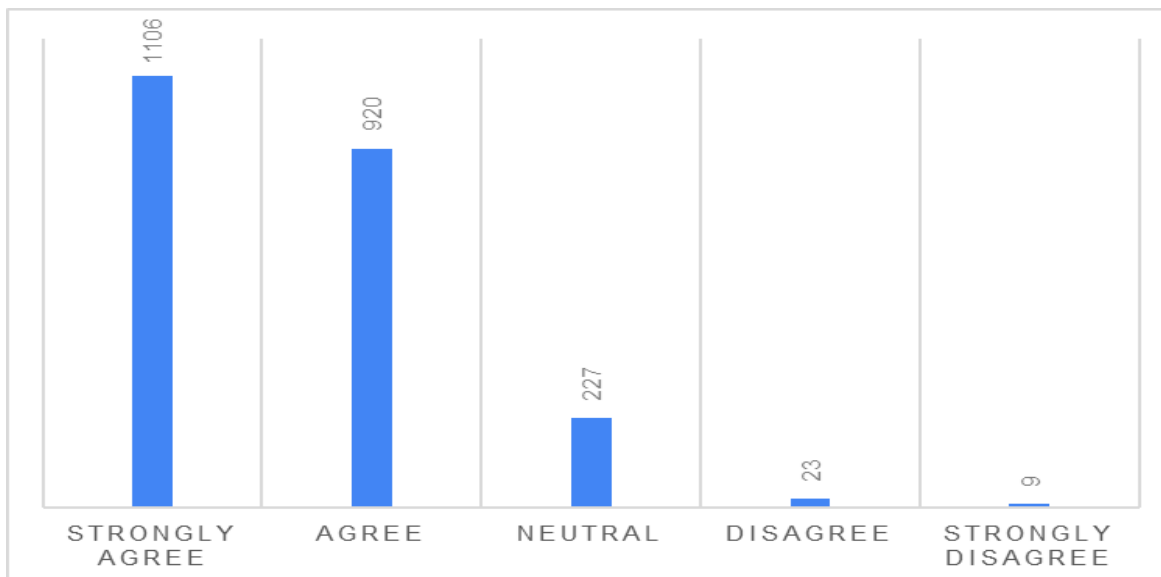

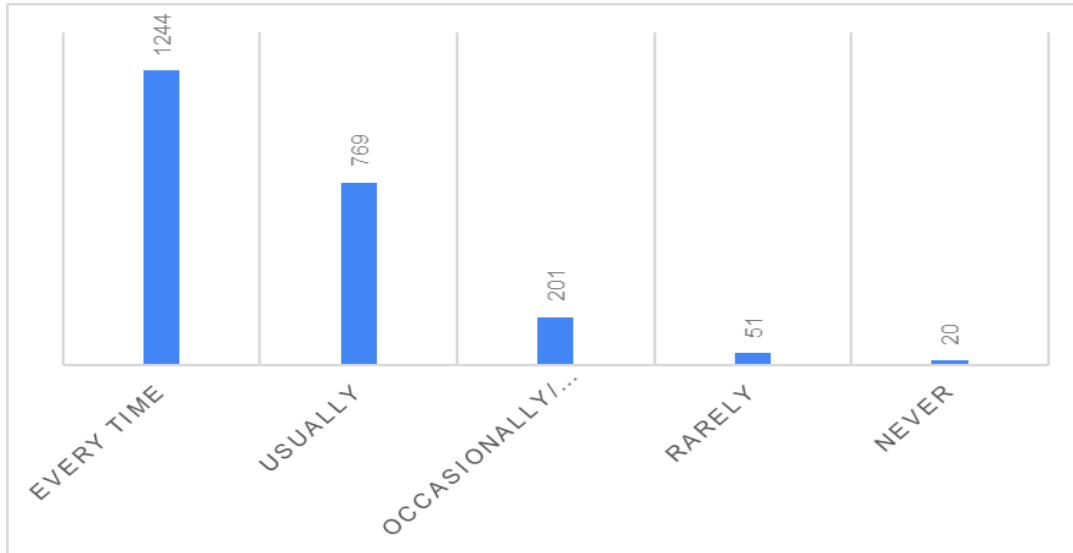

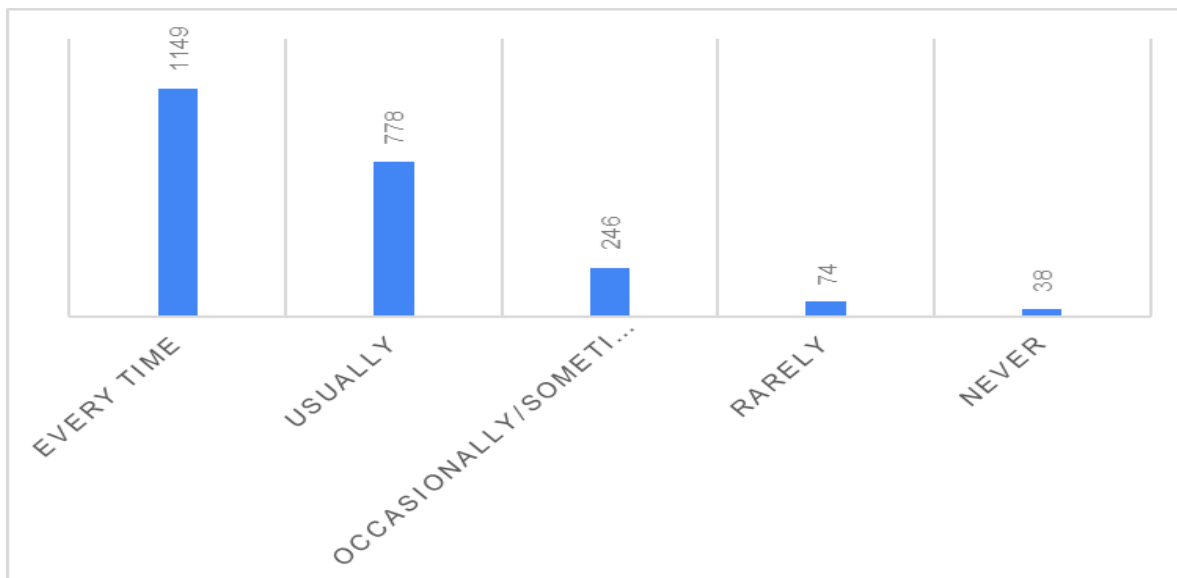

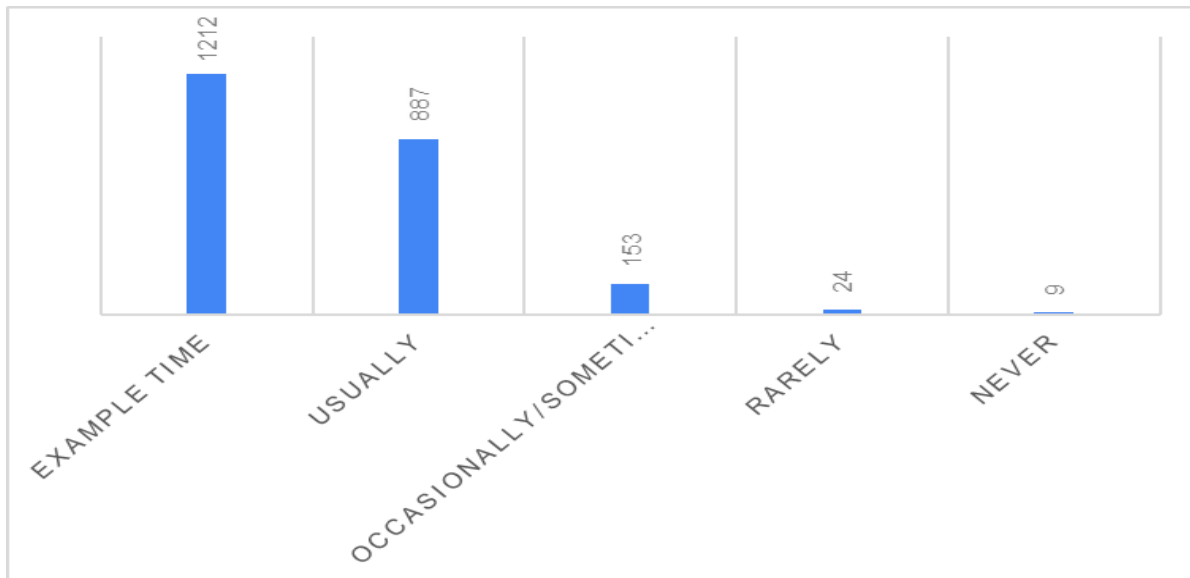

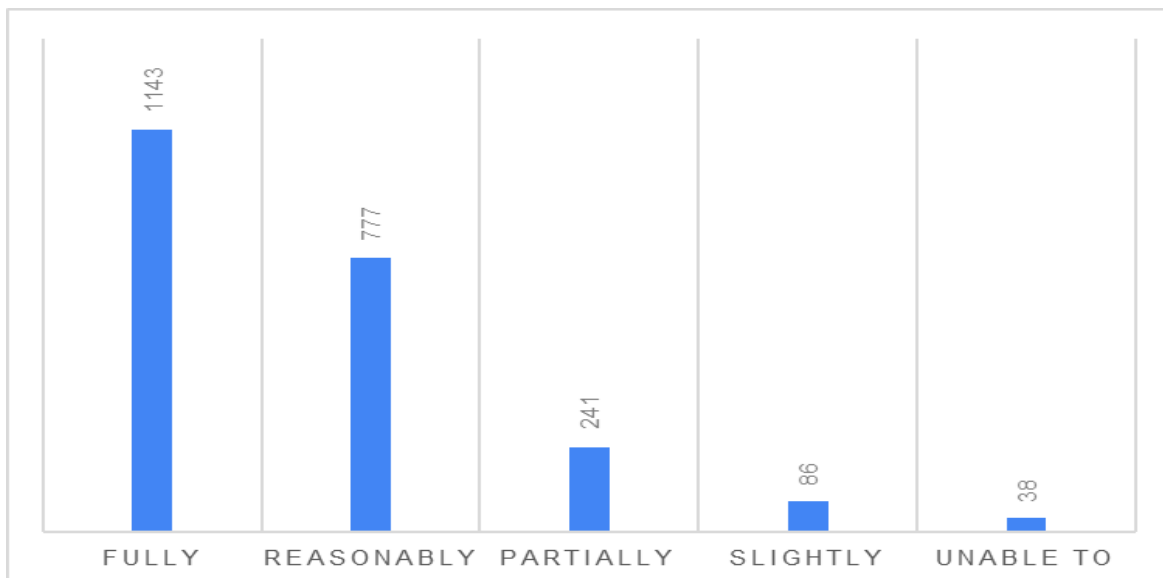

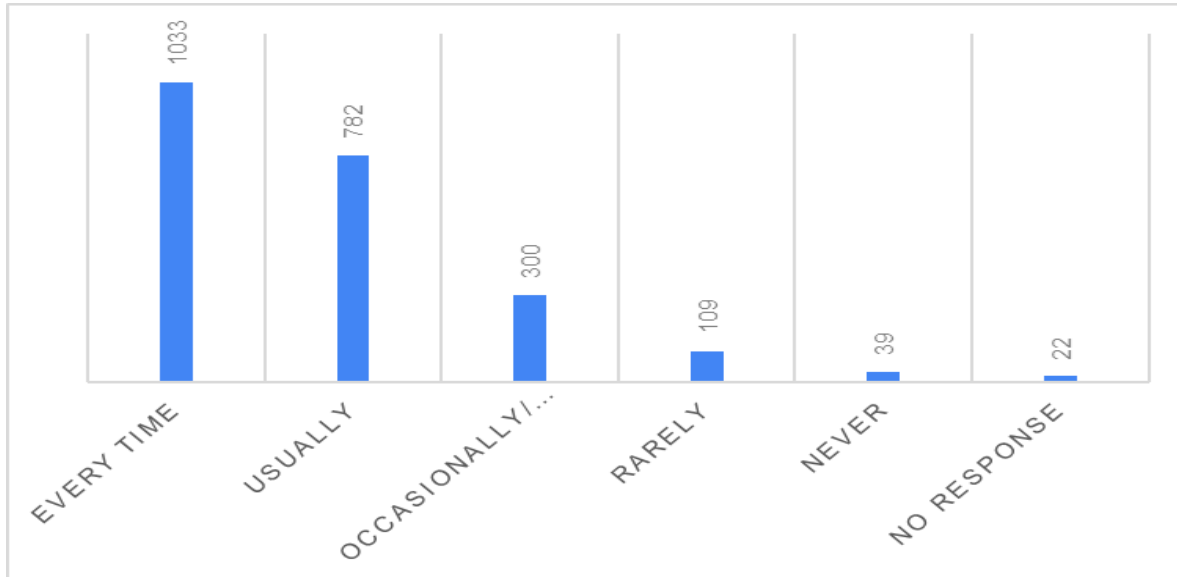

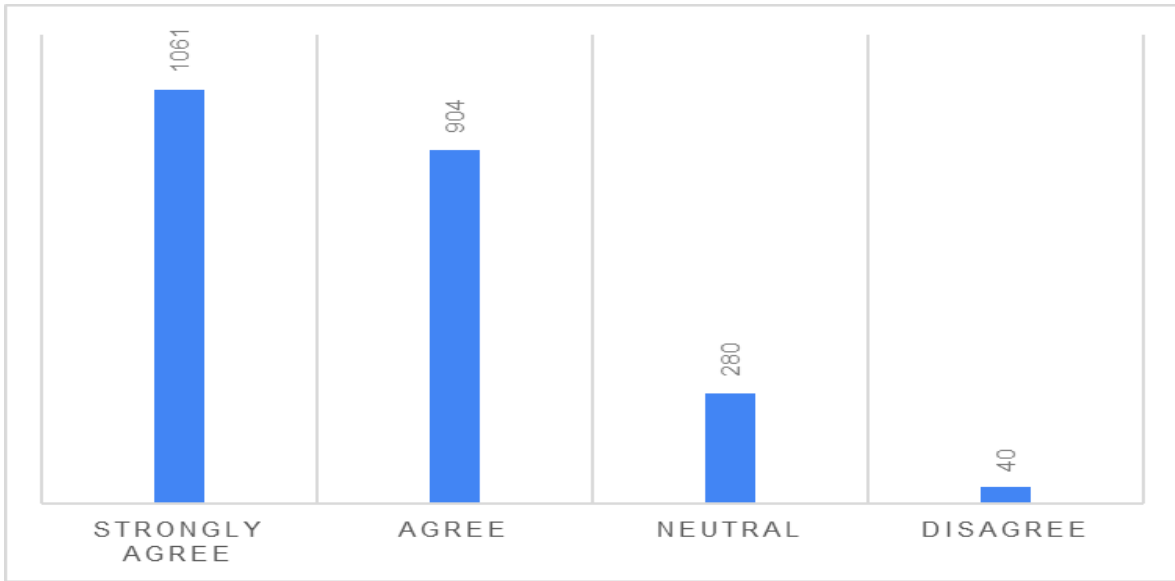

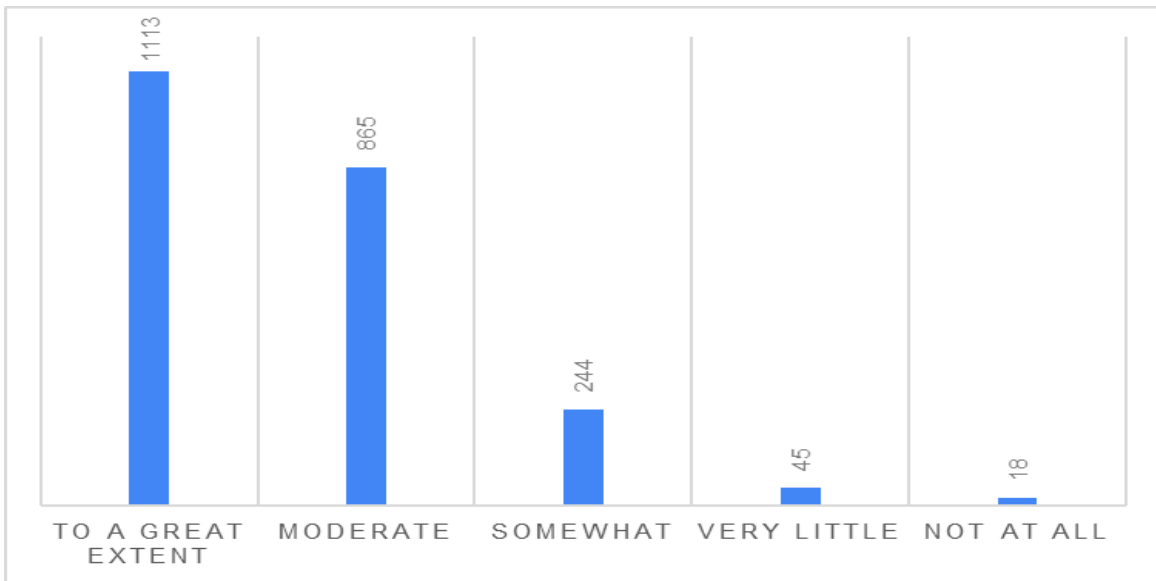

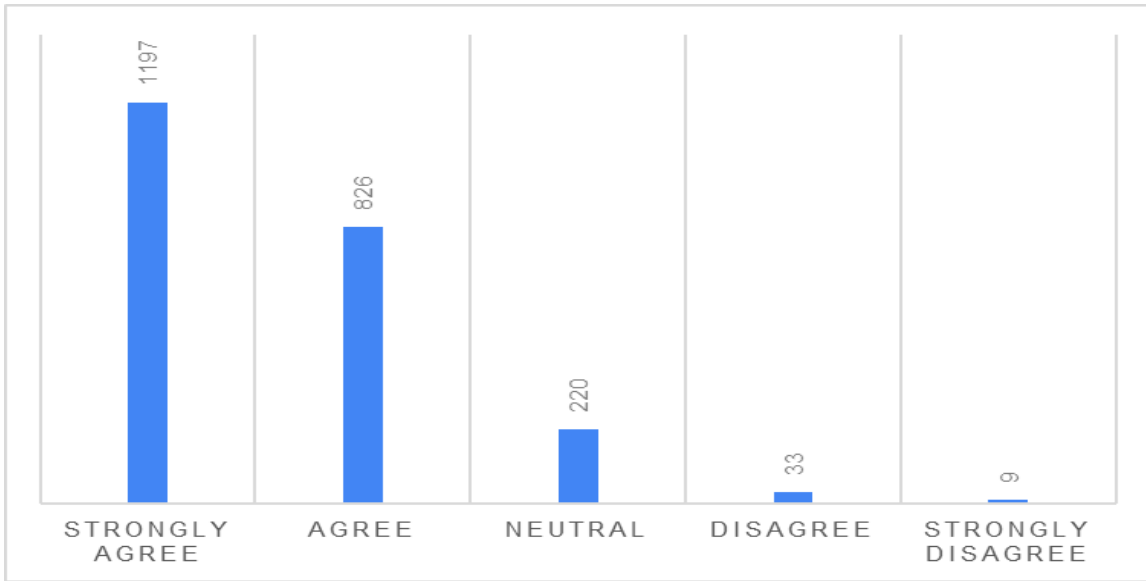

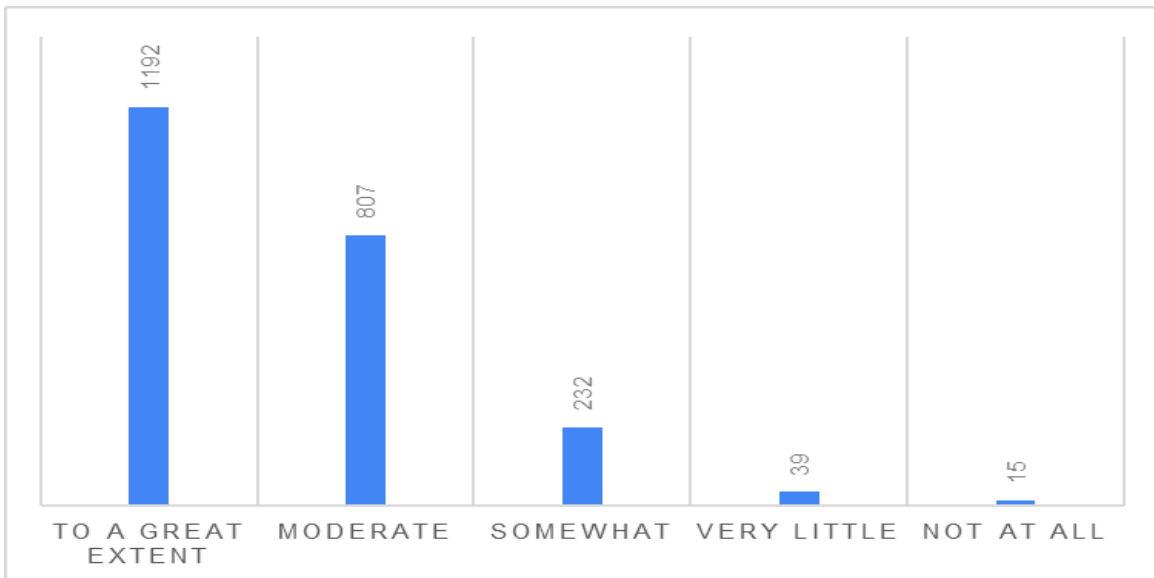

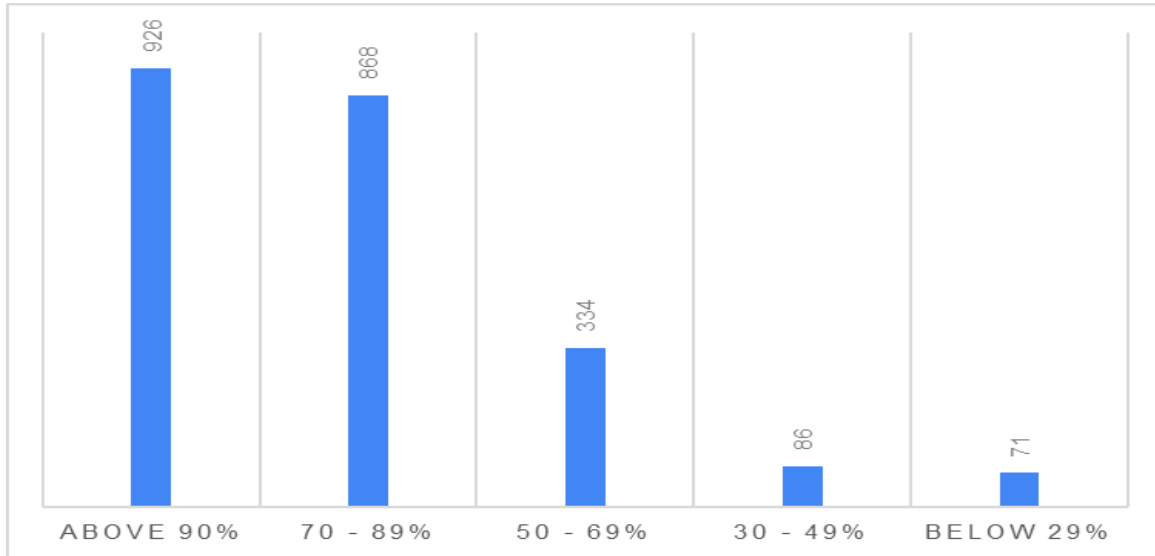

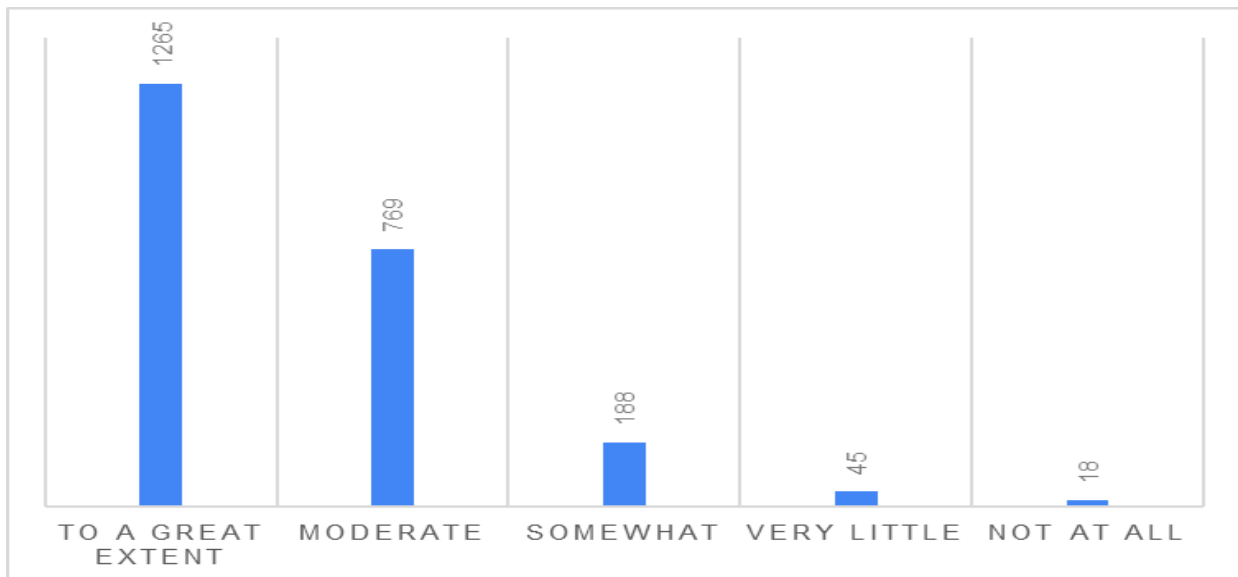

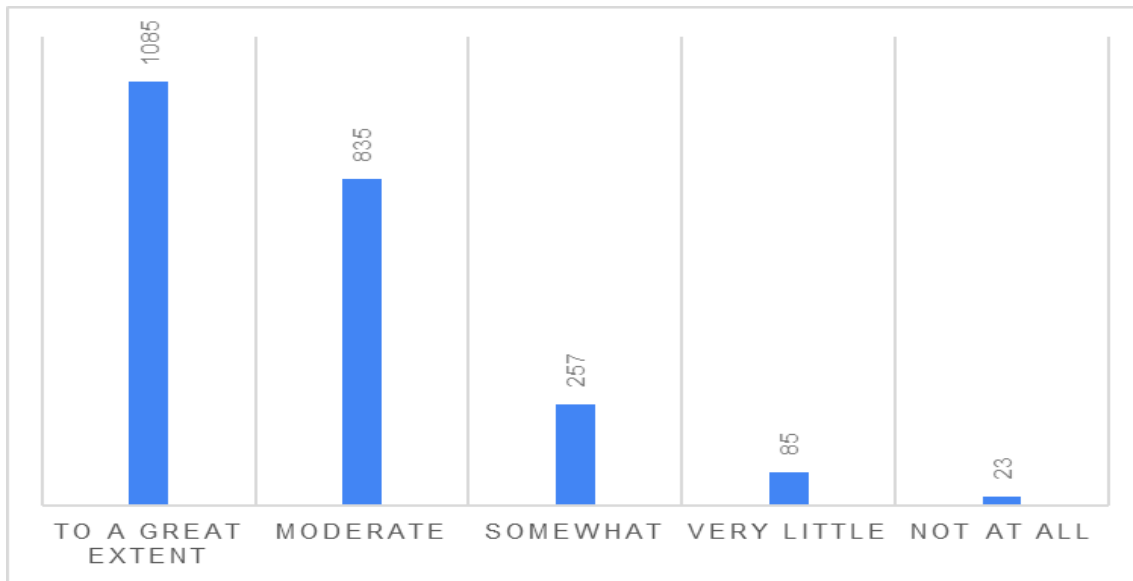

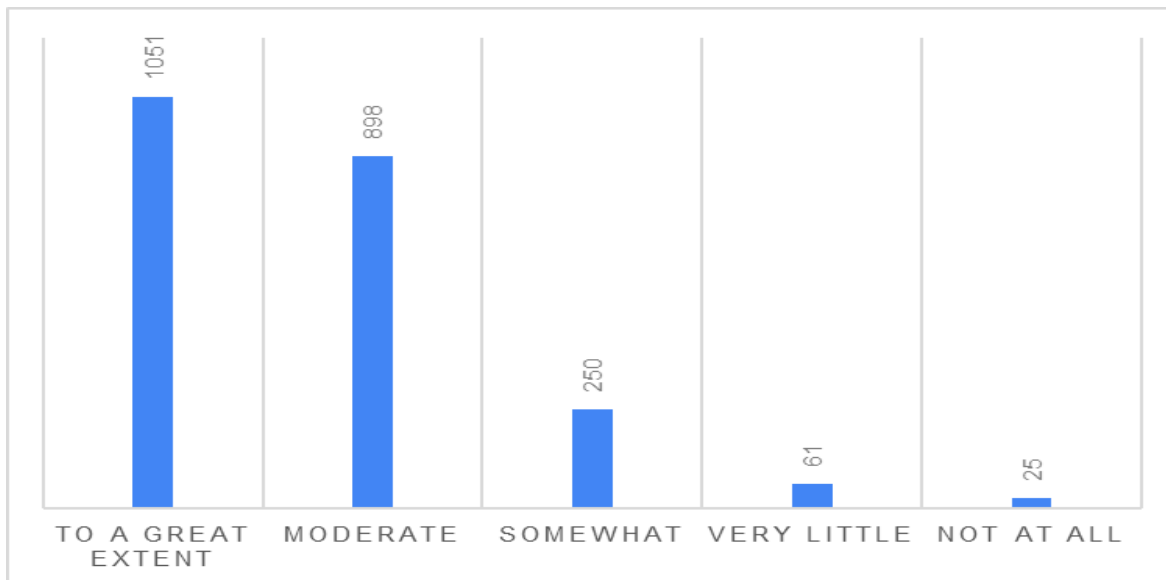

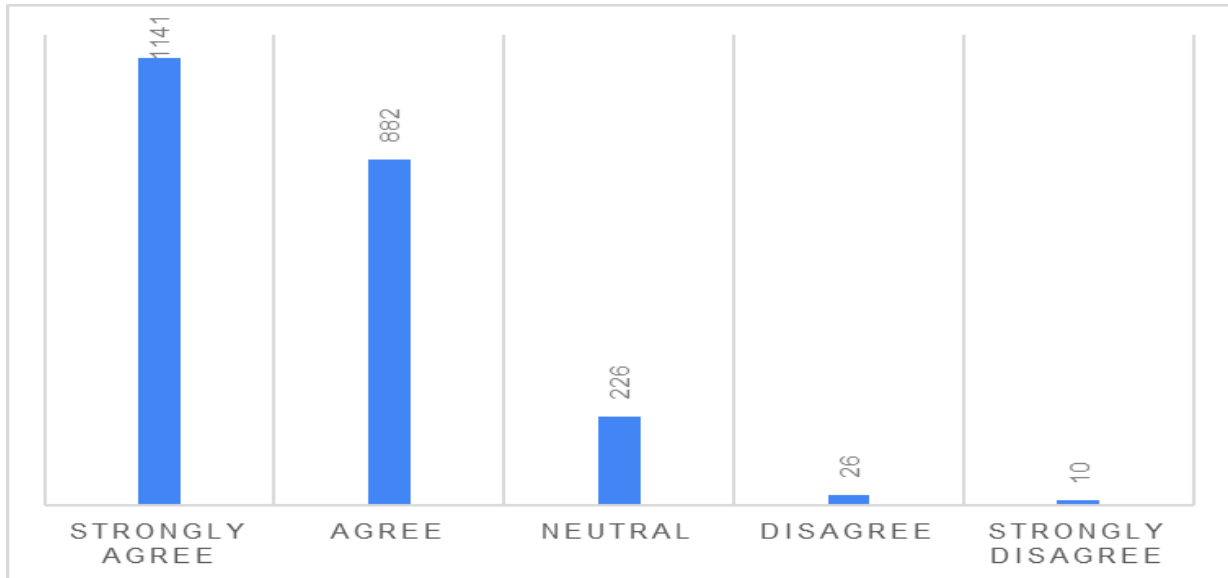

4. Organising more skills and career guidance seminars to increase skill based learning.
5. More Field visit to be organized.
6. Creating an environment for skilled entrepreneurs.
