1. Dr Koel Roychoudhury initiated the meeting by welcoming all members present. She briefed the members about the successful NAAC visit and the achievement of A grade by the college. Dr Koel thanked all stake holders and remembered with gratitude the contribution of our ex-principal Dr Milind Vaidya whose efforts played a major role in the successful completion of NAAC Accreditation.

2. Dr Neera Kumar convenor of IQAC thanked all stake holders for their support during NAAC process and also expressed her immense gratitude towards Prof. K. Venkataramani for his total support.

3. Dr Neera Kumar introduced new members joining IQAC committee this year. They are

4. Mr. Bharat Iyer was now inducted as alumni representative and in his place Mr. Harshal Patil was inducted as student representative.

5. Dr. Neera Kumar welcomed Dr. Meghna Bhatia as teacher representative and Mr. Himanshu Vyapak as Industry representative.

6. Prof. K. Venkataramani appreciated the efforts of teachers, students and other stake holders for achieving A grade in NAAC Accreditation. He stated that the faculty student ratio is satisfactory for accreditation purposes. He reviewed the status of permanent affiliation and Autonomy work.

7. Dr Koel Roychoudhury presented a SWOC analysis of the college on the basis of the recommendations of the peer team was prepared. Dr Koel listed these points as follows

a. Strengths-1. College is a brand name trusted by all sections of society

2. Good Infrastructure and ICT resources
3. Proactive management
4. Attention given to special Children

b. Weakness- mentioned by peer team included dependency on university and lack of strong industry linkages and lack of adequate research culture. Dr. Koel presented an action plan to remedy these weaknesses. The Action Plan included the following aspects-



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1. The college has planned to introduce market oriented courses and certificate courses for students.

2. Collaboration with other colleges and external organizations is planned. MOUs will be signed to encourage internships. The placement cell will provide more training activities. MOU with other college for academic collaboration will be signed.

3. A Research centre will be set up in the college under the University of Mumbai. Research Culture will be fostered in college by providing incentives to teachers and students to carry out top quality and innovative research activities.

c. Opportunities-

1. The college has the potential to promote skill learning and increase placements for our students.

2. The college seeks to secure more ranks and awards at the local state and national level.

3. The College seeks to introduce more PG courses like M.com Business Management and M.A. Business Economics.

4. The College has made available hostel facilities by signing an MOU with Nair Associates.

5. MOUs will be signed to encourage coaching for students for competitive examinations.

6. The College will strive to provide reservations for backward class students and physically handicapped students from next academic year 2022-23

d. Challenges-

1. Faculty student ratio is 1: 70

2. To sustain the good name of the college based on vision and Mission of the SIES Trust.

8. Prof. K. Venkataramani also suggested that the positive points from the NAAC visit must be uploaded in the college website. Also weaknesses and Action plan to resolve them can also be mentioned. Mr. Venkataramani also appreciated the IQAC members and placed on record his gratitude for doing an excellent work during the process of NAAC accreditation.



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9. Dr. Koel Roy Choudhury also stated that the College has applied for Permanent Affiliation from the University of Mumbai and the college is awaiting the dates of the LIC visit.
10. Dr Koel Roychoudhury informed that Centre for Skill Development is constituted from the academic year 2021-22. The placement cell would be renamed as Career Guidance and Placement Cell. Teachers will also be encouraged to undertake E-content Development using the available resources.
11. Ms Sugandha Jha and Ms. Ananya Gon informed about 2-days online International Multidisciplinary Conference on "Post Covid breakthrough in various sectors of the Economy and Technology" which would be organized by IQAC, Department of Economics, Department of Commerce, Department of Management Studies, and Department of Computer Science on 26th-27th November 2021.
12. Dr. Koel Roychoudhury suggested that counseling committee will organize National Conclave "Darpan" to help students to deal with mental health issues and emotional health in the month of January 2022.
13. Ms. Bhumika More informed that webinar was organized on 12th October 21 to understand the guidelines and process for preparation of Autonomy and NAAC fourth cycle Reaccreditation by Prof. Dr. Moushumi Datta, Vice-Principal, IQAC Coordinator, Professor in Department of Geography, Nagindas Khandwala College.
14. Dr. Neera Kumar informed that a webinar on NIRF – A tool for Institutional Branding: will be organised for all the Teaching and Administrative faculty members on 16th December 2021.

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MEETING MINUTES

1. Dr. Koel Roy Choudhury briefed the committee about the status of Autonomy work and informed that a committee of staff members has been formed to apply for Autonomy of the College from UGC.
2. Dr. Koel Roy Choudhury informed the committee that add-on Courses like Vedic mathematics, Advanced Excel, Ethical Hacking and Foreign Languages have been introduced in the academic year 2021-22.
3. Dr. Koel Roy Choudhury informed that 2 new certificate courses would be introduced by inhouse faculties. Department of Commerce will design and introduce Certificate Course on 'Event Management' and Department of Management Studies will introduce Certificate course in 'Student Social Responsibility' from 31st January 22.
4. She also mentioned that Career Guidance and Placement cell is active and companies like Deloitte have recruited our students from Information Technology Department.
5. She also informed that a Webinar titled NEP 2020: Innovative Pedagogies For Quality Education will be conducted on 11th January 2022 and a national webinar for the non-teaching staff on 'Effective Office Management' - DAKSH will be organised on 13th January, 2022. A National Level Webinar on Intellectual Property Rights in Higher Education will be conducted by IQAC, Department of Economics, Commerce, Banking and Insurance in association with Department of Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade on 4th February, 2022 through Microsoft teams.
6. Mr. Himanshu Vyapak thanked the college management for making him part of IQAC. Since he belonged to the Financial Service industry he promised to help in developing Entrepreneurship opportunities and Internship support. He also questioned about the presence of an alumni Association. Ms. Bhumika More replied that alumni association facilitates guest lectures from professional alumni members from different fields. Mr. Aditya Subramaniam detailed the various activities of the Alumni Association including social initiatives to help the students and the larger community.



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7. Prof. K. Venkataramani also suggested tying up with IIT Mumbai and TISS for organizing certificate course programme for our students.
8. Prof. K. Venkataramani also suggested that the college can go for external academic audit. Dr Koel Roy Choudhury replied that college has planned for external academic, administrative, gender, Information Technology (IT) and Environment and Green audits in the month of April 2022. Prof. K. Venkataramani also suggested that Mr Aditya, Mr. Bharth and Mr. Himanshu could give the college a questionnaire to fill and give a feed back on the readiness of the college to face future challenges. The report prepared after all audits must be placed in the IQAC meeting.
9. Mr Aditya mentioned that the Linkedin page of the college should be designed in a more vibrant way. MOUs can be signed with more corporate organizations. Capacity Building programs can be started for specially identified children. Skill Development programs can be started for our students by tying up with NISM and NCFM. A dedicated teacher must oversee these courses.
10. Mr. Aditya also said that if 3 percent reservations are provided for Physically handicapped students then adequate and suitable infrastructure also has to be provided for them. For example ramps, toilets, software must be created for them. He also suggested that the college take advantage of the Unnath Bharath scheme where colleges are encouraged to adopt villages in association with NGOs. The scheme is remunerative and beneficial to the college. Dr. Koel RoyChoudhury informed that 3 percent reservations will be provided from academic year 2022-23
11. Dr. Neera Kumar informed that internal academic and administrative audits were conducted on 21st, 22nd and 23rd April 2021.

4. NAAC Accreditation Process:
 - a. Mock NAAC for peer team visit was organised on 31st July 2021 wherein online interaction with students, parents and alumni was conducted alongwith few departmental and committee presentations.
 - b. Exhibition and Cultural programme were organised.
 - c. The NAAC peer team members' visit was successfully completed on 6th and 7th August 2021.
 - d. The college successfully secured A Grade (3.01/4.00)
5. A webinar on "POCO Attainment" was organised on 20th April 2022.
6. Programme outcome and course outcome attainment levels were calculated for the Undergraduate Programme (2019-2022) and Post Graduate Programme (2020-2022).
7. Feedback on syllabus was taken from various stakeholders such as students, parents, alumni, faculties and employers. After discussion, the report was forwarded to Board of studies members.
8. Students' Satisfaction Survey was conducted for academic year 2021-22.
9. Internal audits were conducted on 20th July, 22nd July, 23rd July, and 21st December, 22nd December and 23rd December 2021. External academic, administrative, Informational Technology (IT), Gender, Environment and Green audits were conducted on 12th April 2022.

12. Teaching, Learning and Evaluation (Shift from online platform to offline/hybrid mode)
 - IQAC facilitated a conducive environment for online and offline (HYBRID) teaching learning and evaluation process.
 - Adequate infrastructure was available for smooth conduct of lectures in hybrid mode.



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- Extra assignments and question banks were given to students to prepare them for offline examinations.
- Offline tests and semester end examination for first year students, Online mock test, internals, practicals, semester end examinations for second year and third year students were smoothly conducted as per guidelines of University of Mumbai.
- Head of Departments moderated papers assessed by new faculties. Overall the evaluation process was transparent.
- Inhouse faculties of Department of Commerce and Department of Management Studies designed content and successfully conducted for Certificate course in Event Management and Certificate course in Student Social Responsibility respectively.

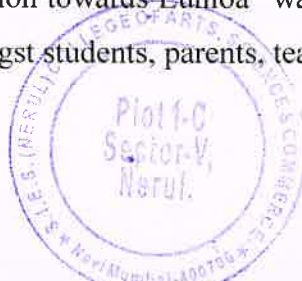
