

3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?





4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as






6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?












9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.






11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.




12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.










15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.










18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills , language skills and technology to make you ready for the world of work.









21. Was the teacher able to engage the students in Online sessions?




