









1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 2,533 responses





2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 2,533 responses








5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.









10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.




















19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.







24. Give three observation/ suggestions to improve the overall teaching - learning experience in your institution – (Below are summarized suggestions from 2533 responses.)

1. Many students said that their experience was good and enriching.

2. Teaching should be more practical based with real examples. Use of graphics, visual media and multimedia while teaching should be incorporated.

3. Many students preferred offline lectures over online lectures. Based on situation and university regulations, blend of both methods- hybrid method is adopted.

4. Technical and connectivity issues during lectures. Improvement in infrastructure is needed for better delivery of lectures.

5. Interactive methods of teaching should be encouraged.

6. More practical sessions especially with syllabus with numerical.

7. Organising more skills and career guidance seminars to increase skill based learning.

8. Guidance lecture on NET/SET should be conducted.

9. More electives options should be included in syllabus.
