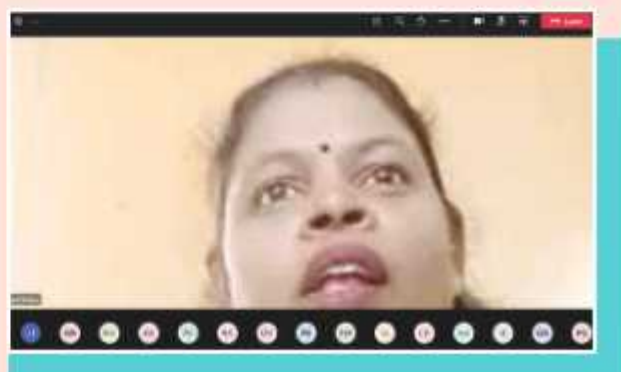
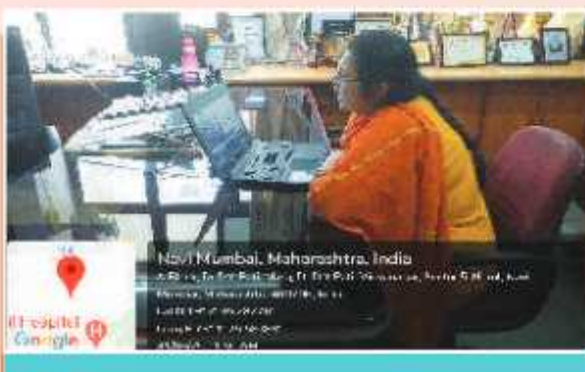

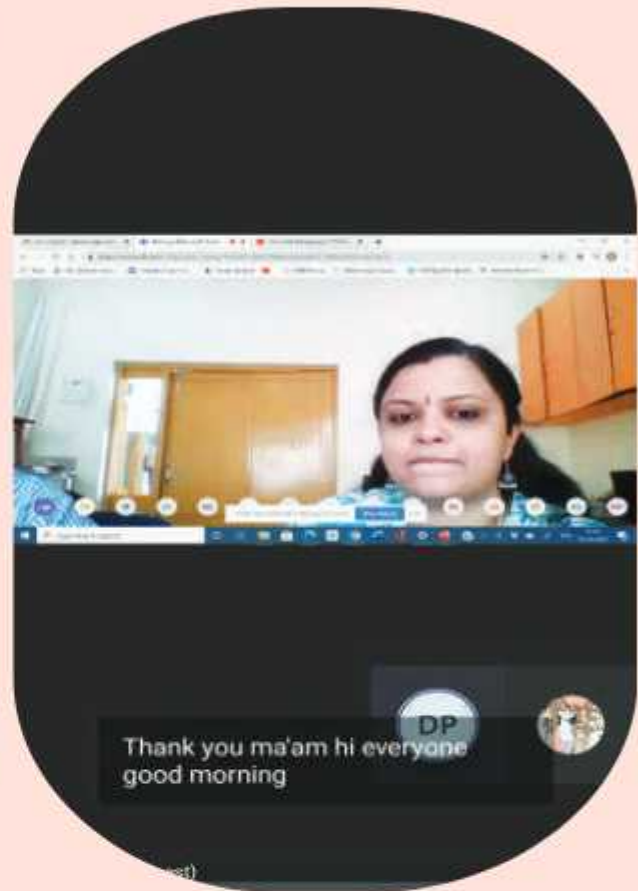

## QUIZ

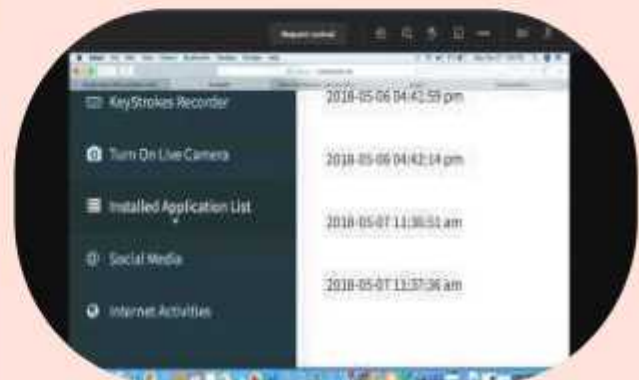

the subject of research methodology. Approximately three hundred and twenty research papers on various topics were covered, merged and submitted.



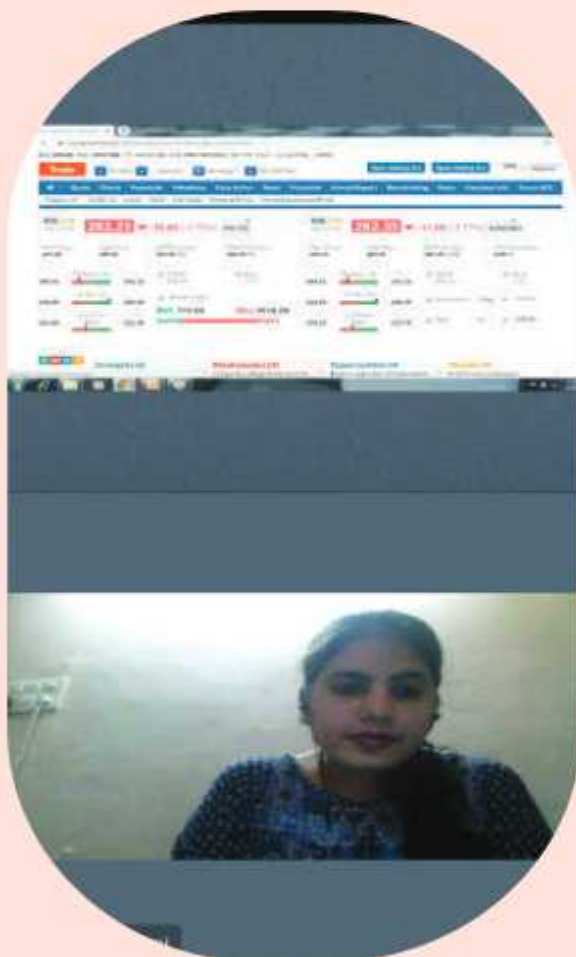

- ❑ The College faced the NAAC peer team during the Peer Team Visit (PTV) which was scheduled on 6th and 7th August, 2021.

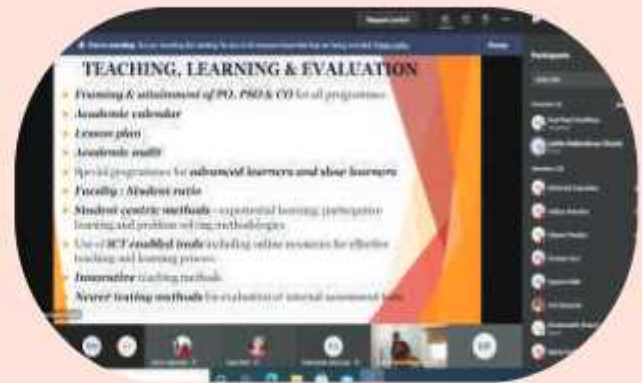
### WEBINAR ON COPYRIGHTS

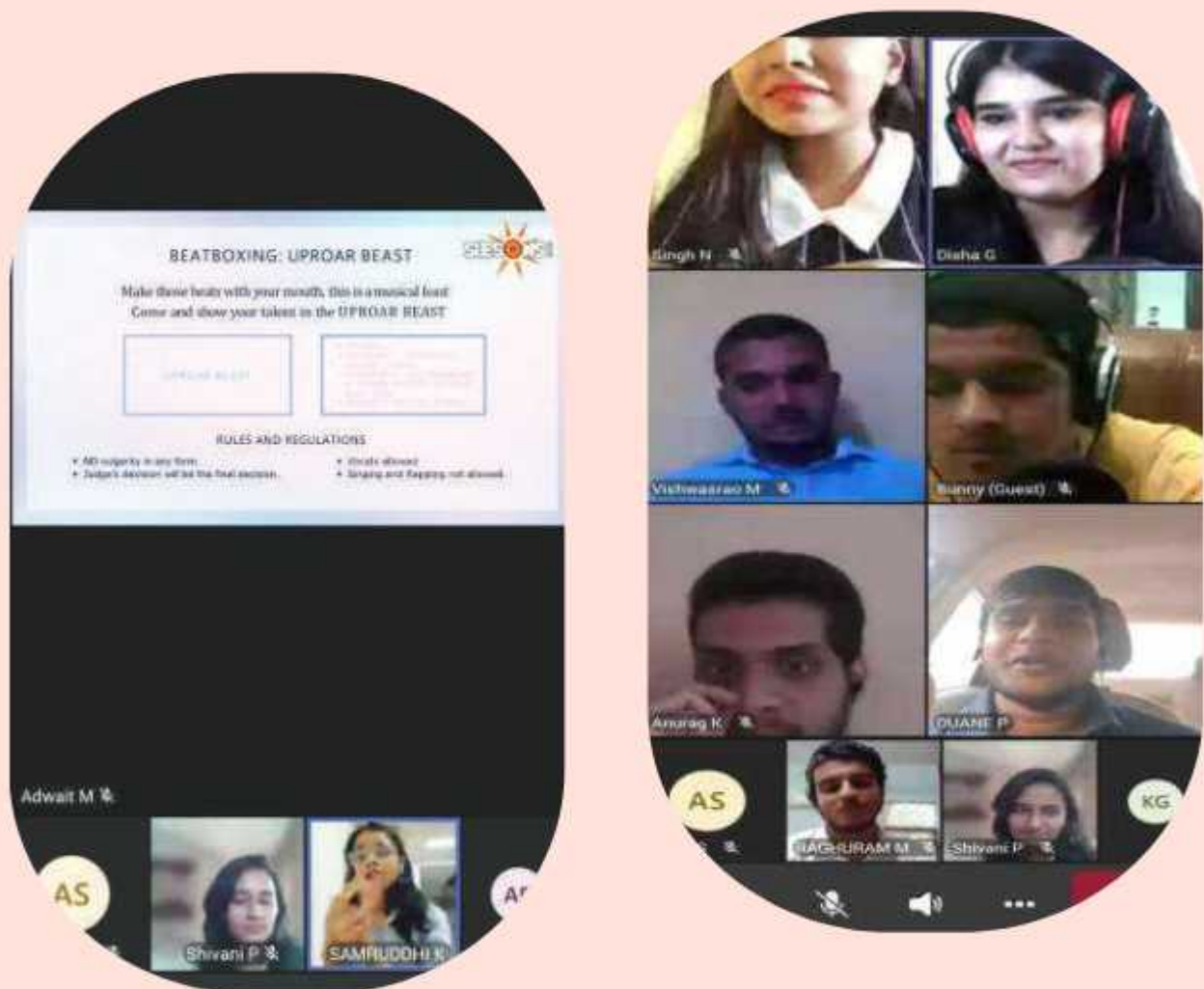


## THEME RELEASE

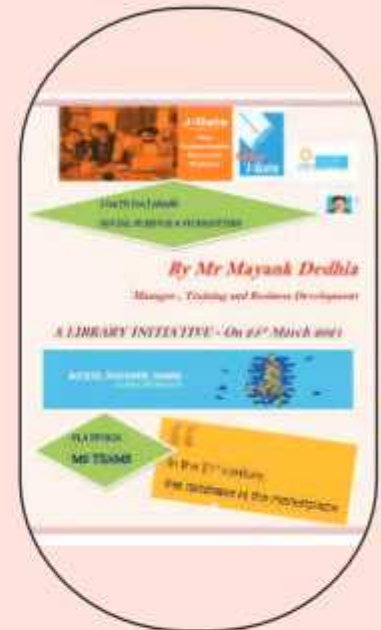
### CAREERS IN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

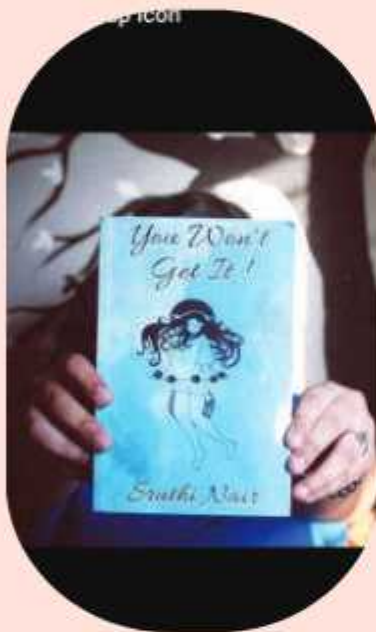




## DISCOVER YOUR PASSION

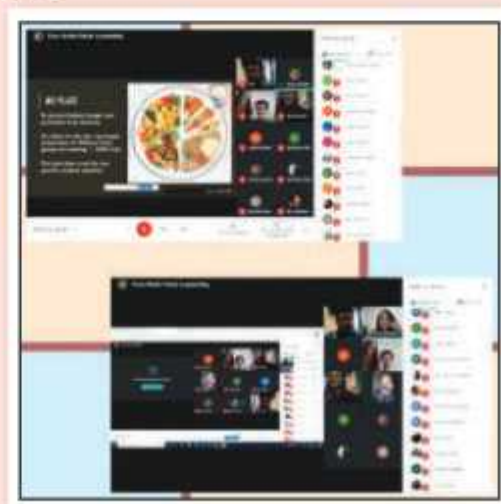


## FILM-O-MANIA

## FACTOZONE

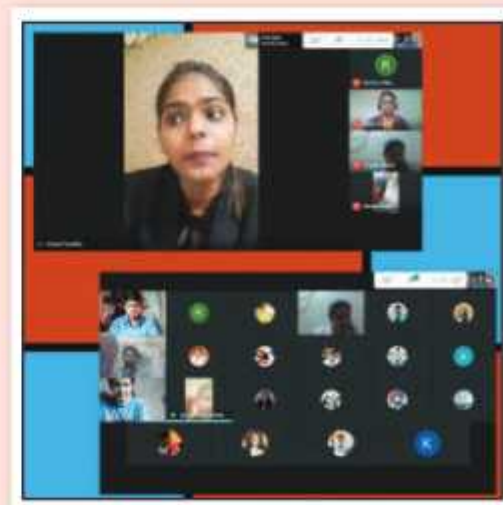
The event titled Factozone was conducted on 16th September, 2020 which included screening a video on facts related to ozone layer with the voice over of International Service Directors.

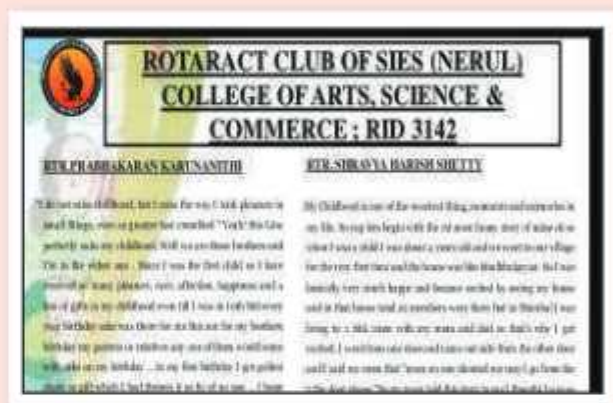
# CHECKMATE 3.0

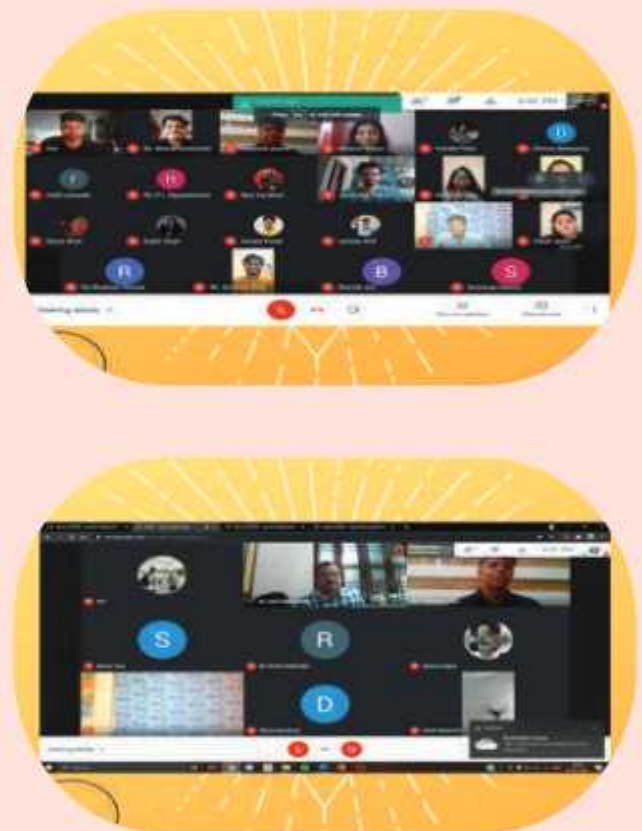
## JAGRUT BHARAT PHASE- I

Eminent Minds Business Consultants LLP is a multidimensional organisation. It provides array of learning programmes for students.

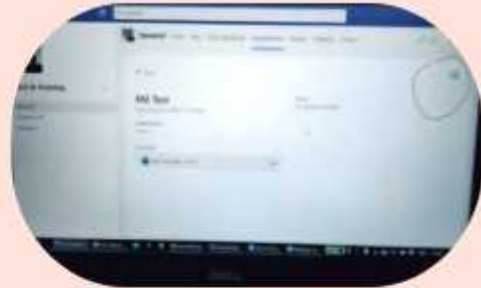

# Women empowerment and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

NEP 2020 has been designed by scientist K. Kasturirangan Committee. It is built on the foundation pillars of Access, equity, quality, affordability and accountability. This policy is aligned to the 2030 agenda for sustainable development goals and aims to transform India into a vibrant knowledge society and global knowledge superpower by making both school and College education more holistic, flexible.

Education is fundamental for achieving full human potential, developing an equitable and just society, and promoting national development. Providing universal access to quality education is the key to economic growth, social justice and equality, scientific advancement, national integration and cultural preservation; and for India's continued ascent, progress, and leadership on the global stage. India will have the highest youth population in the world over the next decade, and our ability to provide high-quality educational opportunities to them will shape the future of our country. Education is the single greatest tool for achieving social justice and equality. Inclusive and equitable education - while indeed an essential goal in its own right - is also critical to achieving an inclusive and equitable society in which every citizen has the opportunity to dream, thrive, and contribute to the nation (NEP2020).

The aim of NEP is to ensure equity and inclusion through education by addressing all forms of exclusion and marginalization, disparity, vulnerability and inequality in education access, participation, retention and completion and in learning outcomes. Reducing gender inequality in education is one of the important objectives of NEP 2020. Some of the important features of NEP related to women's education are as follows.

The Government of India will constitute a "Gender Inclusion Fund" to provide quality and equitable education for all girls. The fund will focus on ensuring 100% enrolment of girls in schooling and a record participation rate in higher education, decrease gender gaps at all levels, practice gender equity and inclusion in society, and improve the leadership capacity of girls through positive civil dialogues.

The policy will emphasize the number of women in leading positions of the institution, including principals, teachers, wardens, physical instructors, and other staff.

All educational institutions will be mandated to conduct awareness sessions on gender issues to break stereotyped gender roles, on the importance of

harassment-free environments and equal treatment of genders, and on legal protections and entitlements for girls and women including the Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses Act (POCSO), the Maternity Benefit Act, and the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act. This training will aim to raise teachers' and educational administrators' awareness of gender-sensitive and inclusive classroom management.

The National Education Policy advocates having female role models for girls, in order to strengthen their ambition and change societal mindsets of women's role. This move will ensure that there is a positive multiplier effect on girls and their families and more girls will be encouraged to pursue education and complete the cycle.

There are specific goals to be taken by Higher Educational Institutions for implementation of gender equality.

- Institutional Development Plans that contain specific plans for action on increasing participation from SEDGs.
- Mitigate opportunity costs and fees for pursuing higher education;
- Make admissions processes more inclusive;
- Make curriculum more inclusive;
- Increase employability potential of higher education programmes;
- Develop more degree courses in Indian languages and bilingually;
- Develop bridge courses for those students that may come from disadvantaged educational backgrounds;
- Provide socio-emotional and academic support for all such students through suitable counselling and mentoring programmes.

Higher education must help women to become leaders with decision making capabilities to achieve the best for themselves and the society. The equal participation of women in higher education will help India make a vital contribution to sustainable development.

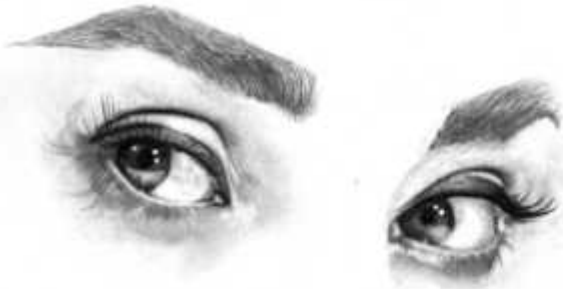
