

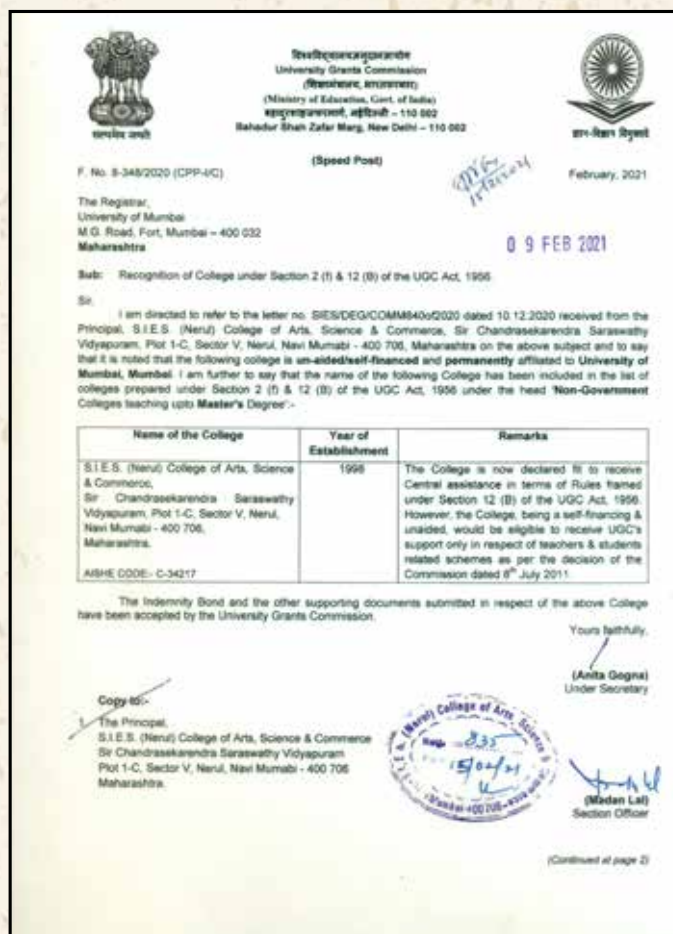

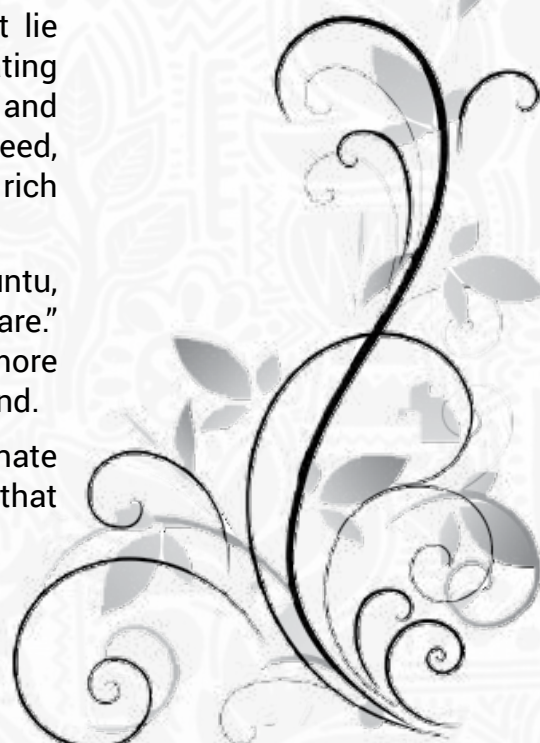

Junior College

◆ **Frames Film Festival**

The Frames Film Festival commenced its three-day event on 6th February 2023. The much-anticipated undergraduate film festival returned and was conducted offline after two years. The details are as follows:

Day 1 (6th February 2023): Acclaimed director Mr. Prabhuraj, actor Deepak Damble and Avinash Mantri, one of the founding members of the festival, were the jury members on the first day. The inauguration was preceded by musical performances. A total of 11 films were screened on the first day.

Day 2 (7th February 2023): The second day of the festival included National short films, animation movies as well as a panel discussion. A total of 16 films got screened on the second day. Film actor Karamveer Chaudhary, Cinematographer AKN Sebastian, and director Raman Bala were the jury members for the national short films category. The film festival received more than 500 entries in this category, but only 9 made it to the final round. For the animation category, documentary filmmaker Sriparakash Menon and film director Ashok Kaul were the jury members. In this category, 7 films made it to the final round and got screened. There was also a panel discussion and audience interaction with a renowned radio jockey J-man, from Red FM.



Day 3 (8th February 2023): Wednesday, 8th February, marked the end of the three-day long Frames Film Festival. The festival concluded with the awards ceremony. Popular film actress Kirti Kulhari marked her presence at the ceremony. Earlier in the day, the screening for the music video category took place. Filmmaker Aniket Nair and famous RJ Vishal Birajdar, an alumna of the college were the jury members for this category. Veteran actress, Beena Banerjee and alumni Dino Shankar, creative director and filmmaker were on the jury for the contingent films category. Before the award function, Chandigarh-based singer-composer Kabir enthralled the audience with his electrifying performance. 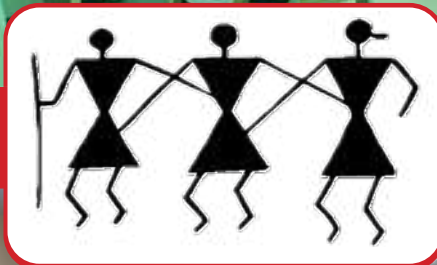
Department of Computer Science [B.Sc. CS & M.Sc. CS]:

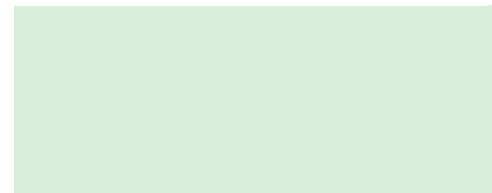
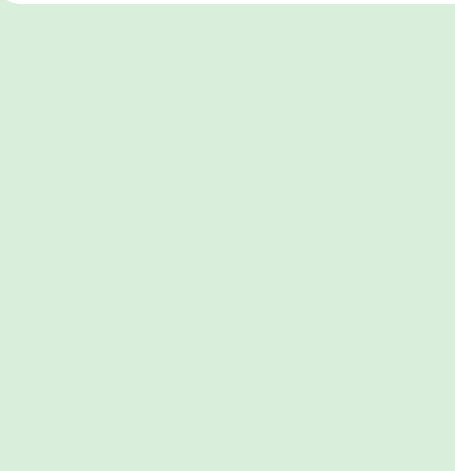
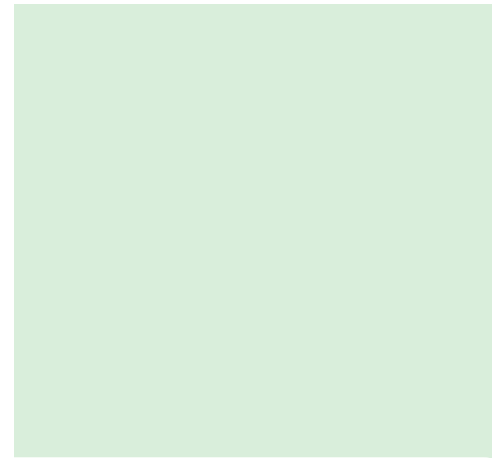
Department of Commerce & Allied Subjects [B.Com & M.Com]:

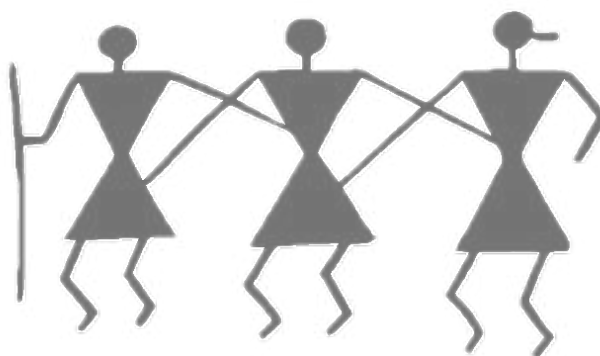

NSS Unit of SIES ASCN was successful in collecting 154 units of blood which proved instrumental in mitigating the blood shortage in blood banks of Mumbai. A total of 84 (38M, 46F) NSS Volunteers were participated in the drive.
- ◆ **Orphanage Visit:** The NSS Unit made a visit to an orphanage called Bethany Children's Home on 12th December 2022. The objective was to understand the lives of the underprivileged orphans. 32 (11M, 21F) volunteers visited the orphanage.

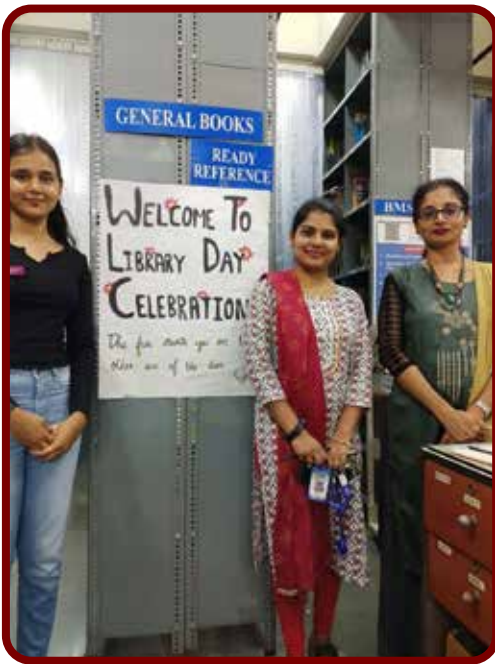


(30M, 25F) students from junior and degree college participated in the event.

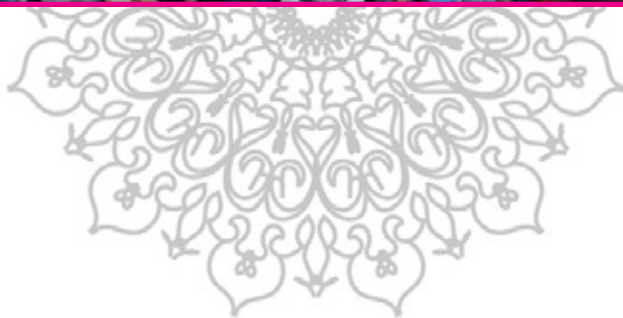

Hurdles in receiving quality education

Recent national data reveals that the dropout rate for girls at the elementary level are 4.10% which rises to 16.88% at the secondary level, with the figures being substantially higher for girls from vulnerable groups (19.05% for SC and 24.4% for ST groups) (U-DISE 2015-16). The retention rate of girls at the elementary level is 70.6% which drops to secondary level is 55.5% (U-DISE 2016-17). Due to existing attitudes regarding girls' education, safety concerns, distance between home and school, lack of affordable sanitary napkins, absence of separate and functional toilets, and poor school infrastructure, several teenage girls tend to become irregular in attending schools or drop out before completing their schooling. Only one in every three girls in India completes school education age-appropriately.

She can make decisions for herself, raise the standard of living for her family and children, generate more employment options and reform the society as a whole. These have surely contributed to girls' education to an extent yet a lot more needs to be done for girls to be truly treated as equal to boys.







Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR):

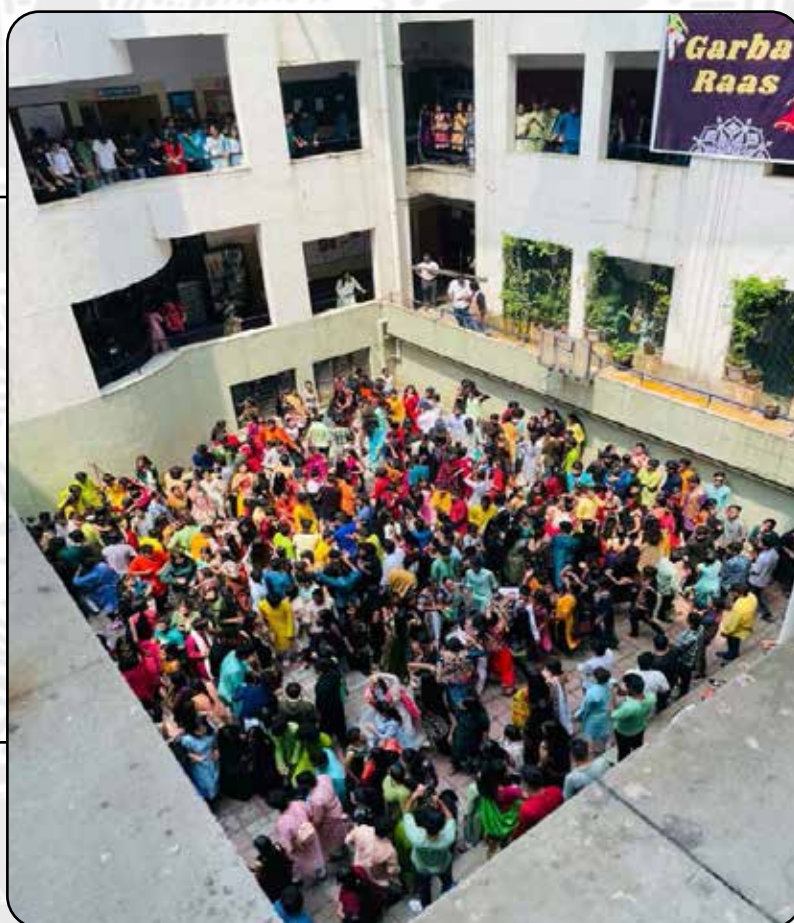
Cultural Committee:

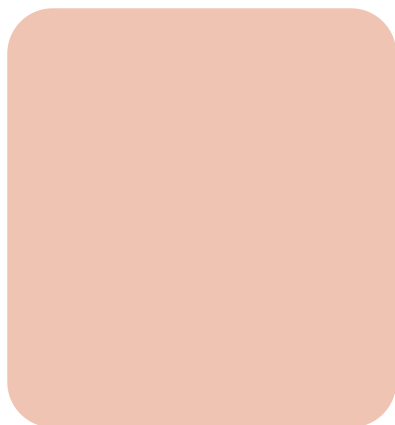
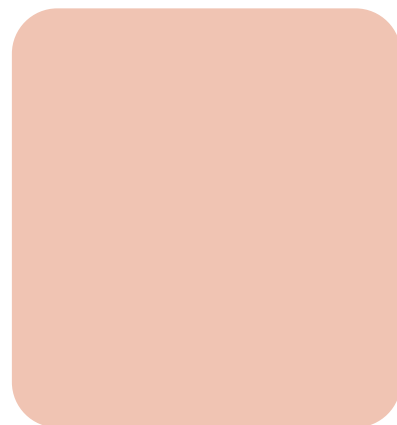




Awards and Recognitions

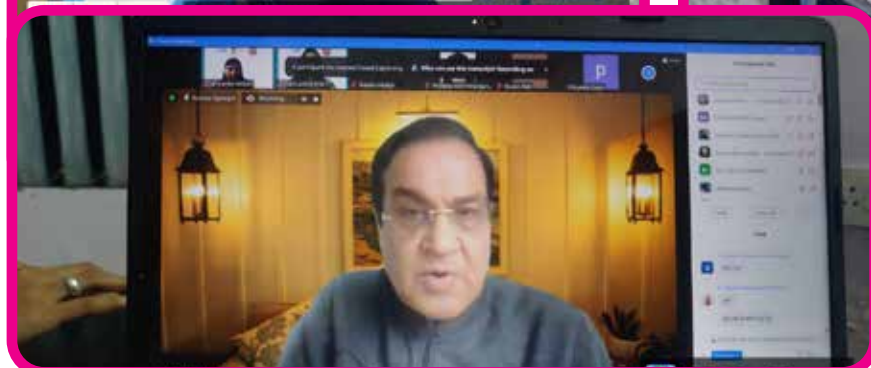
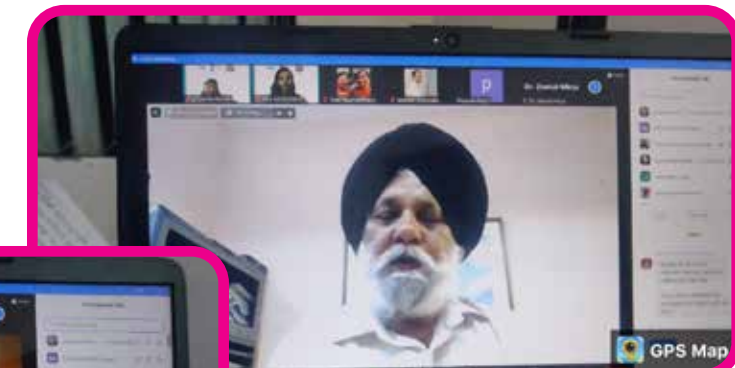


National Level Online Faculty Development Programme:

According to research conducted in 2019, BTS was the reason pre-pandemic for every 1 in 13 tourists visiting South Korea. 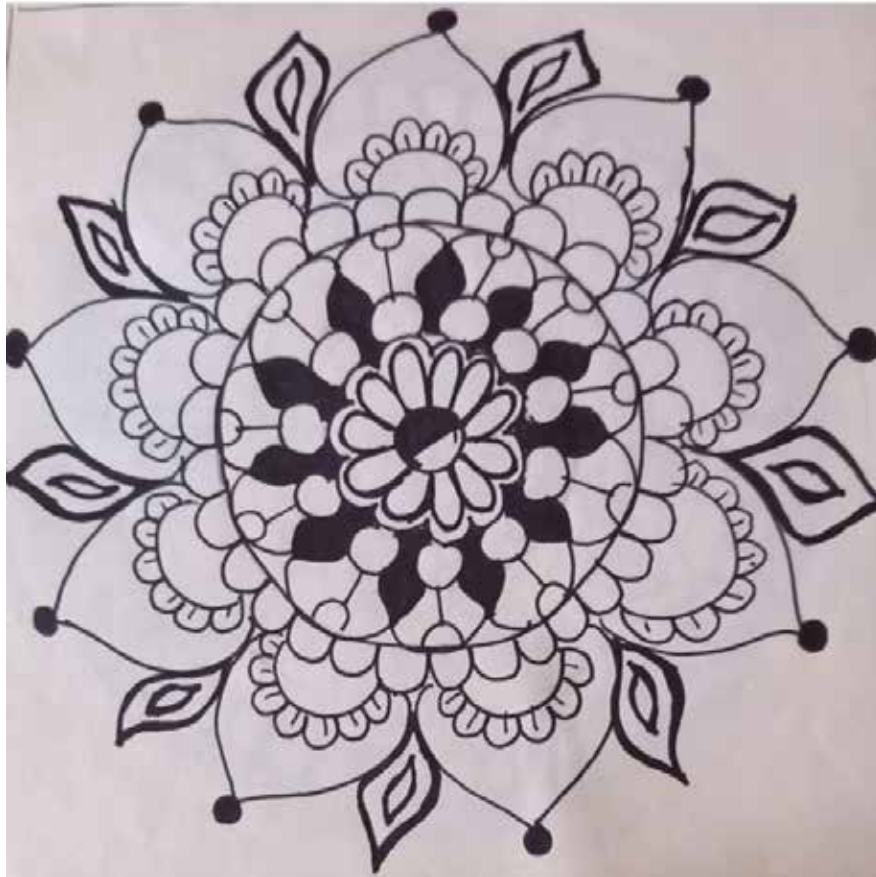

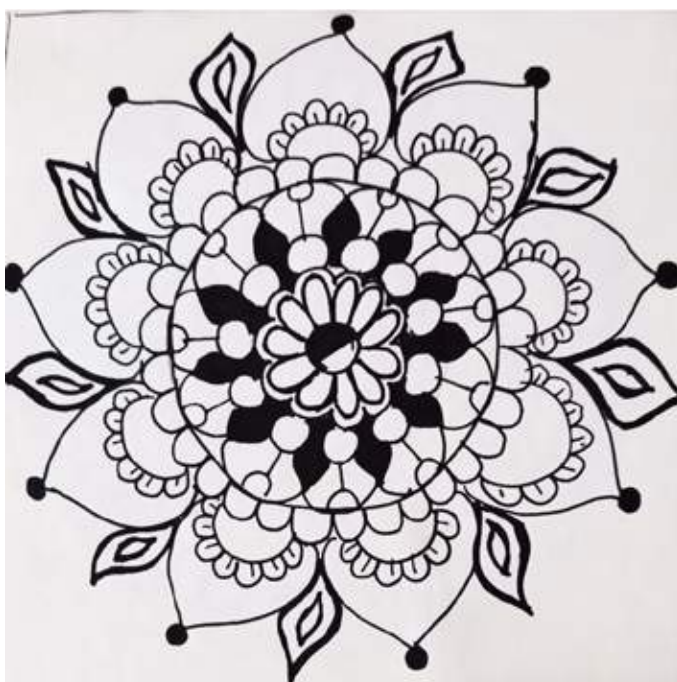

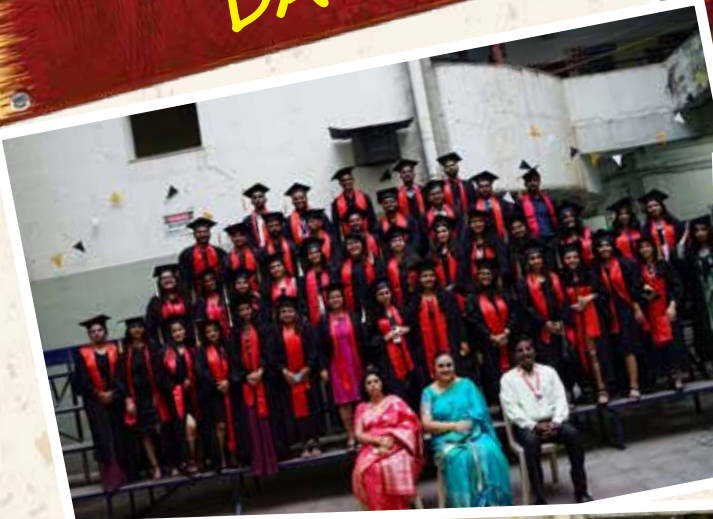
